#### TAX LEVY OUTSIDE THE CONSTITUTIONAL LIMITATION

Proposal: Shall the Board of Education of Blue Mountain Community College be authorized to levy for the fiscal year 1978-79, beginning July 1, 1978, the sum of \$1,993,552 outside the limitation set forth in Section 11, Article XI, of the Oregon Constitution?

Explanation: The college has no tax base; therefore, any tax to be levied by the board must be approved by the voters. The increase over the preceding year is due to inflationary increases in costs of materials, services, salaries, payroll taxes, and the second year of the Associate Degree Nursing Program. Approval of this levy will result in an approximate cost of \$1.78 per \$1,000 True Cash Value, an increase of 12% over the current year's levy. When approved, the operating budget to be financed by local taxes for the 1978-79 fiscal year will be \$135,185 greater than that of the preceding year, 1977-78.
