

# Tax relief bill signed

President Carter has signed into law a measure eliminating an inadvertent tax burden imposed on farmers and ranchers who received delayed disaster and deficiency payments.

This is another step in the efforts of Congress to assure that the economic impact of

the recent drought is not compounded by problems with federal relief programs, said Oregon Congressman Al Ullman, House sponsor of the measure.

Ullman introduced the legislation after learning from Oregon farmers and ranchers that a paperwork backlog in

the Department of Agriculture had delayed some 1977 payments until early this year. The bill was introduced in the Senate by Oregon Senator Bob Packwood.

The legislation allows most farmers to treat the payments received early this year as 1977 income.

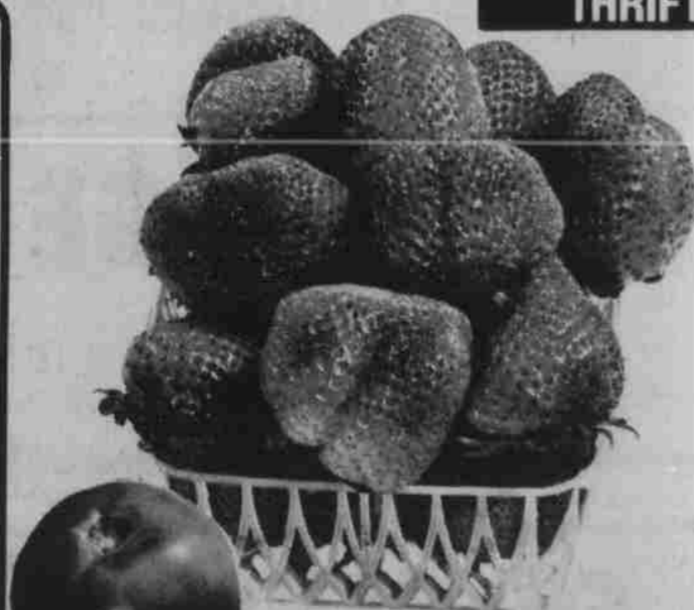
