## Water supply below normal

The most recent water content measurements recorded by the Soil Conservation Service indicate this area's snowpack, which has been below normal all winter, is now melting rapidly.

Snow depth at SCS's Ar-buckle Mountain measuring station was down to four inches and the 1.3 inches of water content was only 12 per cent of the normal water content for this time of the year.

Butler Creek near Pine City point to a stream flow of 30 per cent below normal for the forecast period of April to July.

Generally, water supplies for the area are forecast to range from 53 per cent to 80 per cent of normal while snowpack water ranges from 37 per cent to 42 per cent of average.

Major reservoir storage is above normal and users having access to reservoirs should have adequate supplies. SCS officials predict some late season shortages can be expected from direct diversion sources.

March precipitation was 70 per cent of normal and soil moisture is near normal in most areas tested.
