Bookworms review Irving Wallace book, "The Two"

At the April 15 meeting of the Bookworm Club, Helen Currin reviewed the 1978 biography "The Two" by Irving Wallace and his daughter Amy Wallace. This Simon and Shuster publication was a

recent Book Club selection. The account of the lives (life) of the original Siamese Twins who were inseparably tied together at their chests by a thick, fleshy ligament resembling an arm, five to six

inches long and eight inches in circumference, is unique. They were born May 11, 1811, on a bamboo mat in a small houseboat afloat in the river village of Meklong, sixty miles west of Bangkok, the

capital of Siam (Thailand). They became world celebrities, American citizens, married two native-born Southern sisters, and between them fathered twenty-one children, while acquiring respectable

status as landowners, farmers, slaveowners and pillars of their local community.

Chang and Eng could swim, perform gymnastic feats and lead "normal" lives. Together they built their own homes, opened a store, became wealthy gentlemen farmers, skilled horsebreakers and, when necessary, defended themselves with their fists.

As the men grew older, each dreamed of a separate life, despite the obvious risks that an operation would entail, and each feared that the death of one would cause his death, too.

Their natures were not altogether harmonious, for each was a highly individual person—Eng, quiet, contemplative and even-tempered; Chang, hot tempered, quarrelsome and, as he grew older, inclined to bouts of heavy drinking.

After their double marriage they held to a rigid schedule of spending three days at each of their homes until exactly the death both feared took place within one hour when they were 63 years old.

The Wallaces have presented a remarkable biography of the extraordinary brothers who adjusted to fame, fought against begin exploited by showmen and promoters, and met many of the famous people of their time in their travels about this country and Europe.
