

## Kathy Wolff chosen for National Science Camp



Kathy Wolff was recently selected as one of only two represented from Oregon to attend the National Youth Science Camp at Bartow, W. Va., this summer.

Heppner High senior Kathy Wolff has been selected to represent Oregon at the National Youth Science Camp at Bartow, W. Va., from June 30 to July 24.

Only two students from each of the 50 states are selected to attend the camp. Participants are chosen on the basis of superior academic proficiency in science or mathematics. Leadership abilities and involvement with extracurricular activities are also taken into consideration.

Judging was performed by the Oregon Department of Education. The state's other representative in the national program will be Amy Cruikshank of Bend.

Miss Wolff will leave Portland on June 29. Upon arrival at Charleston, W. Va., she and representatives from the other states will meet with West Virginia Governor John D. Rockefeller IV, and tour the state capitol.

After arriving at the camp's headquarters in the high Appalachians at Bartow, near the Virginia-West Virginia border, Miss Wolff and fellow science campers will attend some 30 lectures on subjects ranging from microbiology to wildlife management.

Also included in the program will be field trips to regional points of interests, such as the nearby National Radio Astronomy facility at Green Bank, W. Va., and a tour of Washington, D.C.

Miss Wolff is the daughter of Dr. Wallace H. Wolff of Heppner.
