

Heppner High F.F.A. members score honors at State Fair

Heppner FFA members brought home many top honors recently from the 1978 Oregon State Fair in Salem. Among those exhibiting in the FFA Beef Division, the Heppner Chapter was runner up for the Herdman Award. Each member received a blue ribbon, while in individual standings, Ken Grieb took fifth place overall and sisters Julie and Geri tied for sixth.

In FFA Conformation classes for Angus, Ken Grieb took first place in Class 5, Junior Heifer Calf and Champion Junior Female. Grieb took the Grand Champion Angus Female with this entry. In class 10, Ken Grieb also took first place with his Senior Yearling entry and had Senior Female Champion. He received Reserve Grand Champion Female honors with his Senior entry. Julie Grieb also took first place honors in Class 2, Senior Bull Calf. Geri Grieb placed second on Class 7, with her Summer Yearling Heifer.

In FFA Conformation classes for Polled and Horned Herefords, the single exhibitor from the Heppner Chapter took top honors as well. Kyrnn Robinson of Heppner placed first in Class 10, Senior Yearling Heifers, and went on to receive Champion Senior Female. She also received a plaque for Grand Champion Polled Hereford. Female donated by the American Polled Hereford Association. In addition, Robinson was awarded the Oregon Polled trophy for the highest scoring Polled Hereford exhibitor at the Oregon State Fair. Selection is based on sportsmanship, herdsman's showmanship, and placings in classes. Presentation was made at the awards ceremony August 29.

On August 27, Heppner's FFA exhibitors displayed their talent as showmen and again received many top honors. The Angus Showmanship Division saw Julie Grieb take first place in Class 1 and a return. Ken and Geri Grieb placed first and second respectively in Class 2 and both had returns to compete for Champion Showman. Kyrnn Robinson received first place in Class 2 of the Hereford Division and a return. In the Championship class of all

breeds, Geri Grieb bested a field of 14 to take Grand Champion Beef Showman honors for the second consecutive year. Geri was also named Champion Angus Showman while Ken Grieb took Reserve Champion. Kyrnn Robinson was named Champion Showman of the Horned Division, Hereford Division.

The competition continued as Heppner's FFA Judging teams took part in the Livestock and Dairy Judging Contests on Tuesday, August 29. The Livestock team placed a respectable 11th out of a total of 66 teams, while the

Dairy team placed 26th in its division. Members judging on the Livestock team were: Ken, Julie, Geri Grieb, Marie VanScholack, and Kyrnn Robinson. Comprising the Dairy team were FFA members, Pat Clark, Dan Nix and JoLynn Daly. Traveling with the team members was Heppner FFA Advisor Hal Whitaker.

At the Oregon State Fair, the lone Morrow County exhibitor in the FFA Swine Division represented the Riverside FFA Chapter in grand style. Donald Richards of Irrigon was named the Reser-

ve Grand Champion Swine Showman. Donald, a senior this year at Riverside, exhibited a Berkshire Cross market hog and received fifth place in the single market hog division.

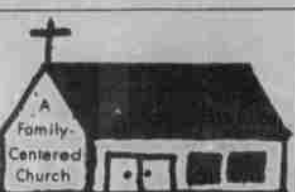
Methodist youths plan Sept. 23 dance marathon

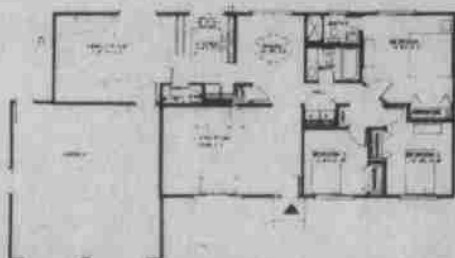

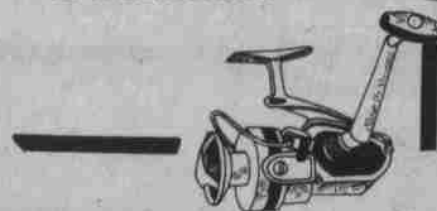
