

**Pavement damage stressed**

**Studded tire use Ok after Nov. 1**

The use of studded tires on Oregon's highways for the coming winter season will be allowed starting Nov. 1, H. Scott Coulter, state highway engineer announced this week.

Under state law, studded tires are permitted on Oregon's highways during the period November 1 through April 30 of the following year. Coulter asked that users defer putting the studded tires on their cars until they are necessary, because of the damage they cause to bare pavements.

Coulter said the effect of studded tires on pavement markings result in extreme damage, and occurs at a time

when these markings are badly needed. The tires also crush the reflectorized glass beads used in pavement markings, thereby rendering them of little value. They also dig ruts in pavements which

collect water, and increase the potential for hydroplaning, and cause extensive splash and spray during wet road conditions.

Department of Transportation cars again will not be

equipped with studded tires, Coulter said.

Enrollment at Blue Mountain Community College is slightly ahead of last year at the end of the second week of school.

There are 952 part- and full-time students registered, compared with 947 at the same time last year. Friday, Oct. 6, marked the last day to register or add a class.

In the evening division, some growth is expected as soon as enrollment

figures have been compiled. With incomplete tallies, there are 833 evening students compared with 933 last year. Up to 150 may be added to this current figure when results are final.

"We are almost exactly where we were last year," according to Truman Baily, registrar. "There is a state-wide trend to more part-time students and that trend is showing."
