

Mustangs out of district playoffs

Ione Jr. High second in jamboree

Hopes for a district playoff berth went up in smoke last weekend, when the Heppner Mustangs took a 75-55 beating at the hands of league-leading Pilot Rock, only to be clobbered by number-two Weston-McEwen the following night by a 90-55 margin.

Pilot Rock, sparked by a 22-point scoring effort by Jeff Lavendar, kept up a blistering 53 per cent shooting average from the court, mostly from outside the key.

Although the Mustangs

trailed by as much as 27 points, they closed to within 10 in the final quarter. But the Rockets' Jim Post slammed in two quick baskets to end the threat, with Pilot Rock pulling ahead by 20 when scoring ended.

The Rockets dominated the boards as well as the shooting game, prompting Heppner Coach Tom Day to comment that they "really looked like the league leaders in rebounding." Howard Huddleston was the Mustangs' top rebounder

with seven, followed by Dale Holland.

Bryan Marlin picked up 14 points to lead Heppner in scoring, followed by Dennis Peck with 10; Dale Holland, 7; Lionel Wood, 6; Curtis Day, 4; Darrell Bigelow, Jim Parker, Mike Stookey, Howard Huddleston and John Bier, each with two.

"We didn't play a tough defense or a consistent offense," Day said.

The situation was even gloomier on Saturday, when Heppner traveled to Athena.

The Tiger-Scots wasted no time in racking up a gaping lead: "They hit their first nine shots from the floor," Day noted, "and they just kept going." Weston-McEwen rolled up a searing 70 per cent shooting average during the first half, helping to remove

any hopes the already demoralized Mustangs may have harbored for coming from behind. The Tiger-Scots shooting rate cooled slightly in the second half, to a still impressive 51 per cent.

Day blamed "a lack of mental preparedness" for the loss.

Heppner maintained a 33 per cent shooting average, with only Jim Parker scoring in double figures with 12.

Also making points for the Mustangs were Dennis Peck and Dale Holland with nine apiece; Howard Huddleston, eight; Marlin and Cole with four each; Stookey, three, and Wood, two.

The Mustangs face Umatilla and Wasco this weekend, both games scheduled to be played at home.

Ione's junior high basketball team lost to Helix by one point in overtime to finish second among four teams competing in Basketball Jamboree action Saturday in Helix.

The Junior Cards qualified for the championship game against Helix by whalloping Echo 14-8. Tournament games consisted of two six-minute periods. Craig Gutierrez and Donny Taylor each dropped in six points to spark Ione's

its victory over Echo, while Tim Patton was the game's leading rebounder.

Helix beat Pilot Rock's "B" team to qualify for the championship contest against Ione, which resulted in a 10-10 tie as the final horn sounded.

In the overtime period, Helix picked up three points—one better than Ione—to take the tourney crown.

Making points for Ione were Roger Morter, Craig Gutierrez and Donny Taylor, each with four.

"We had a good chance to win, but we just didn't cash in," commented Ione Coach Bob Deeter. "Both teams played good defense. Helix has a good team, there's no question that they'll be good in the future."

Echo beat Pilot Rock in the

consolation game, giving Echo a third place finish.

The Junior Cards end their hoop season this afternoon, Thursday, with a showdown against Arlington. Counting tournament results, Ione now stands 6-3 for the season.
