apparently had used up their quota of luck the previous week.

The Cards were unable to contain the Honkers' well-oiled scoring machine, sparked by 6-5 senior Jim Bailey, who picked up 18 points in the match.

Arlington led 33-16 at the half, but the Cards cut their lead by four points in the third quarter, then closed within nine points with five minutes left.

The game once more within reach, the adrenalin level rose in Cardinal players and fans. But as the Cards narrowed the score, "we got a little panicky," Coach Del LaRue commented. "We threw up a few shots that shouldn't have been there. It's good that we could come back like that, but we just didn't have the power to stay up with those people. They have a lot of tournament experience."

The Honker proceeded to put the game out of reach in the remaining minutes, during which Card starter Dennis Stefani strained an ankle and was sidelined.

In addition to his 18 points, Arlington's Bailey was credited with 17 rebounds. All in all, the Honkers picked up 37 boards to the Cards' 24—nearly half of their offensive rebounds.

High point men for Ione were McCabe and Stefani with 11 each. Danny McElligott picked up eight, followed by Robin LaRue with six. John Lindstrom with four, Gregg Rietmann with three and Shawn LaRue with two.

The scores were closer when

Ione faced Helix to decide the winner of the consolation bracket on Saturday, but the results were the same.

"Both teams played rather flat," said Coach LaRue, despite the fact that no more than four points separated the two teams throughout the contest.

After a lackluster three quarters of trading baskets, with three minutes remaining on the clock, only one of the Cardinal starting five—Gregg Rietmann—remained on the court. Robin LaRue and Danny McElligott had fouled out. Stefani was on the sidelines with his injured ankle, and Kevin McCabe was on the bench after running out of gas. Ione managed to post a 39-38 lead until the final three seconds, when Wynn of Helix drew a foul and sank a pair of bonus shots. A desperate last-second shot by Ione's Glen Krebs hit the rim but bounced away as the horn sounded.

Rietmann was the leading scorer for the Cardinals with 10 points, while Rydich topped the Helix shooting game with 12. Also making points for Ione were Lindstrom, 8; Krebs, 6; McCabe, 6; Robin LaRue, 3; McElligott, 2; Starr, 2; and Shawn LaRue, 2.

Saturday's contest marked the end of their high school basketball careers for seniors McCabe, McElligott and Lindstrom.

Arlington went on to defeat second-place Dufur by 12 points to recapture the Big Sky basketball crown.

The current crop of freshman hoopsters "is the best group I've coached in a long time," said Holland. "Overall, the kids really improved over the year. Holland said that the season was particularly satisfying to him, since this marks his final year as Heppner's freshman basketball coach.

Two of the Heppner freshman, Farrar and Holland, posted season-long shooting rates of 50 per cent or higher

from the field. Farrar connected on 53 per cent of his attempts from the court, while Holland sank 50 per cent of his field goal tries. Farrar averaged 11.9 points and just over nine rebounds per game, and Holland averaged 10.7 points and eight rebounds.
