pact. Dental insurance benefits would be included for teachers in the second year of the contract, with the benefits expanded to include teachers' families in the third year. However, costs for paying the dental benefits would come out of the anticipated cost of living increases.

In addition, the tentative agreement would create an additional salary increment for personnel with 19 or more years of experience. The county system's current top-

end wage comes after 14 years.

Negotiators must take the tentative agreement back to both the school board and the county teachers' organization for ratification. County Schools Superintendent Matt Doherty called the tentative settlement "a good package for both the board and the teachers," and said he expected a ratification vote would be held prior to the school board's regular March 19 meeting.

Pioneer Memorial to receive emergency equipment

Tentative agreement has been reached to allocate funds to allow Pioneer Memorial Hospital to purchase a 10-ton "porta-power" extrication tool for use in removing victims from crashed vehicles.

Money for the emergency equipment was re-allocated, pending the passage of a written ballot, during a meet-

ing last week in Pendleton of EMS District 12's executive council. The ballot is required to finalize the allocation, since a quorum was not present during the March 1 meeting.

Funds were also tentatively allocated to provide the Heppner hospital with a "resuscitation Annie", a life-size dummy on which the resuscitation and CPR skills can be

practiced.

In other hospital equipment developments, Pioneer Memorial officials were told that the delivery date for two new ambulances for the Heppner and Boardman areas has been set back to late May or early June. Funds for the two new emergency vehicles were provided during the current fiscal year's budget.
