Animation is topic of film workshop

A workshop in film animation will be held Saturday, April 7, beginning at 9 a.m. in the Heppner Junior High art department.

The workshop is open to the public. Participants will have the opportunity to view and discuss various animation techniques, and then actually do some work in film animation.

Instructing the workshop will be artist-filmmaker Ken O'Connell of Eugene, who has taught at Treasure Valley Community College for the past five years. He now teaches film, visual language and drawing at the University of Oregon. He also taught film animation at the Evergreen State College in Olympia, Wash.

The workshop is provided by Visual Arts Resources of the University of Oregon Museum of Art. Funds for the workshop are made possible by grants from the Oregon Arts Commission, the National Endowment for the Arts, the University of Oregon, and Friends of the Museum.

Participants in the workshop should bring the following materials: A Pentel sign pen or other felt-tipped pen; 50 sheets of white typing paper without holes; two sheets of black construction paper 8 x 10 or larger; a pencil, a piece of cardboard at least 12 x 15; and a pair of scissors.

the bill by allowing Morrow County to keep its justice court in Heppner and by writing out the automatic appointment of Hermiston Justice John Smallmon to the new district court.

"We've cut out the district court appointment, which means the governor will appoint the new district

judge," said Thorne. "That way it won't appear as though we tried to come down and legislate a position for a particular individual."

Thorne is trying to smooth out disagreements between the two counties which earlier threatened to block establishment of the district court.

As it is currently drafted,

the bill would abolish the Morrow County Justice Court in Heppner and it would make the Hermiston justice of the peace the district court judge.

Thorne said there was some question about the legality of designating the appointment of an interim judge in the legislation establishing the court. He said it appeared to

conflict with the state constitution which gives the governor the right to make appointments.

Thorne said Smallmon is still a likely candidate for the district judge position since he is the current justice of the peace in Hermiston.

Thorne also proposes to change the wording of the bill

so it clearly spells out how much time the district judge will spend in Heppner. His

amendment would direct the new judge to hold court in Heppner at least one day a week and to spend the rest of the week in Hermiston.

Thorne said he did not see

any problems with allowing Heppner to keep its justice court.

Bob Gangware, a spokesman for the State Supreme Court, said under state law a justice of the peace cannot sit in the same county seat where a district court judge sits.

However, Thorne said he was assured by legal counsel

that the bill can be drafted to get around that stipulation.
