Ms. Johnson was a passenger in a car driven by Richy Floyd Coe of Heppner. Police said Coe's vehicle was traveling eastbound on the freeway when it ran onto the right shoulder, skidded across the highway and struck a bridge abutment head-on. Coe was treated for minor lacerations

at St. Anthony Hospital in Pendleton and released.

Richard Rothe, 33, Bombing Range Road, escaped serious injury about 5 a.m. Friday when Morrow County Sheriff's

deputy Jim Macomber noticed a car parked off the highway just north of the Kinzua mill. As the officer approached the car he noticed flames shooting out from the rear fender. Upon investigation Macomber found Rothe asleep in the car and pulled the driver from the vehicle just before it burst into flames. Two fire trucks from Heppner were called to extinguish the fire.

Rothe was not injured and cause of the fire has not been determined.

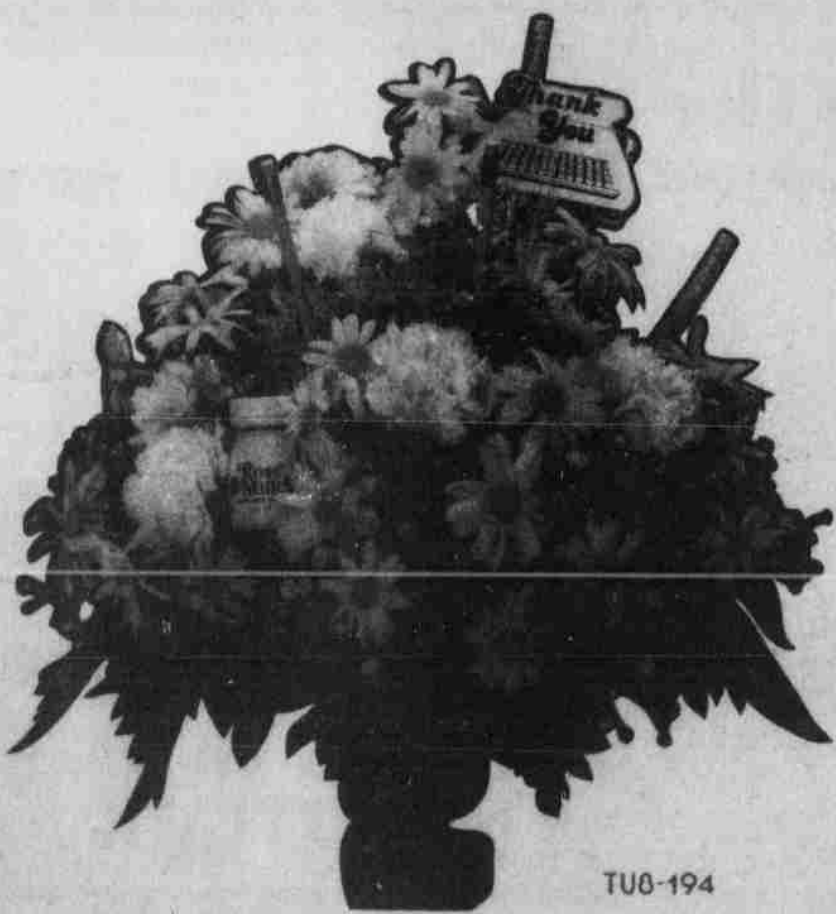
