Cindy Dougherty, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Jerry Dougherty, left Friday to compete in the College Rodeo Finals in Lake Charles, Louisiana as a representative of Walla Walla Community College.

Cindy placed second in regional competition and is rated 13th in the nation in college rodeo competition in breakaway roping and goat

tying. In the regionals at Spokane Community College, she tied a calf in three seconds.

This is the first year in which she has competed, according to her mother.

The Louisiana Rodeo is slated from June 17-23. The college will pay for her flight and accommodations along with those of the Walla Walla team. Mrs. Dougherty said the

team would be borrowing horses in Louisiana because of the difficulties of transporting the animals across the country.

Ron Currin, also of Heppner and a student at Blue Mountain Community College in Pendleton, is also competing at the College Rodeo in Louisiana. Ron's event is bulldogging.

position with Tom Day here for two years and the previous coach, Chris Borgen, for one year.

Holland has been coach of the baseball team for 15 to 16 years and coached all sports

for Huntington, a community between Baker and Ontario as well as Crow H.S. in Eugene.

Dale has worked with the freshman ball handlers for a number of years and expected to coach the same students on this year's varsity. A replacement at the freshman basketball position has not yet been made.

Holland is a Linfield graduate.
