"Umatilla Electric Coop-
erative Association has filed
with the Federal Government
a Compliance Assurance in
which it assures the Rural
Electrification Administra-
tion that it will comply fully
with all requirements of Title
VI of the Civil Rights Act of
1964 and the Rules and
Regulations of the Depart-
ment of Agriculture issued
thereunder, to the end that no
person in the United States
shall, on the ground of race,
color, or national origin, be
excluded from participating
in, be denied the benefits of,
or be otherwise subjected to
discrimination in the conduct
of its program and the
operation of its facilities.
Under this Assurance, this
organization is committed not
to discriminate against any
person on the ground of race,
color or national origin in its
policies and practices relating
to applications for service or
any other policies and prac-
tices relating to treatment of
beneficiaries and participants

the Rural Electrification Ad-
ministration extends the time
for filing. Identity of com-

tial except to the extent
necessary to carry out the
purpose of the Rules and
