Heppner swim team wins 6th in competition at John Day

The Heppner Swim Team placed 6th out of 8 teams in this week's John Day Swim Meet.

Kelli Bergstrom earned four National AAU "minimum time standards" for A team swimmers though competing in a B meet, setting new

records in the 50 yd. butterfly, 33.5, 50 yd. breaststroke, 38.2, 100 yd. I.M., 1:16.4 and 50 yd. freestyle, 30 seconds. She earned a first place medal in the 50 yd. backstroke, setting a new record of 37.8 and a second place silver medal, swimming the 100 yard freestyle in 1:10.5.

In the boys division 11-12, Cam George won a gold medal for a first place finish in the 100 yd. I.M., placed second, in the 50 yd. breaststroke, 41.6, 5th in the 50 yd. freestyle, 34.4, second in the 50 yd. butterfly, 39.6, second in the 50 yd. butterfly, 39.6, 7th in the 100 yd. freestyle, 1:19.4 and placing in the 50 yd. backstroke, 47 seconds.
