Geri Grieb exhibited the Grand Champion Angus Heifer. From the nine head of Angus they exhibited, they also received other firsts, seconds and thirds.

The Northwest Livestock Production Credit Association presented the Heppner Chapter a plaque for Best Chapter Beef Exhibit. The Heppner Judging team placed fourth in the state judging contest. Members of the team were Ann Van Schoaick, Julie and Geri Grieb, Jo Lynn Daly and Terry Gray.

September Garden Hints  
Where did the summer go? Suddenly, morning have a hint of fall, reminding gardeners

that fall garden practices should be started for beauty next year.

Now is the time to plant spring flowering bulbs: daffodils, crocus, tulips, etc. Begin clean up of garden and tools; add plants to compost pile.

East of the Cascades, reduce water on trees, shrubs, vines to harden them off for winter; bring houseplants in-

side. Plant some late vegetables for one more harvest before winter.

Pick and save seeds from marigolds, and other annuals to plant again next year. Look at your garden and plan some entries (both horticulture and arrangements) for the big flower show at Ione, September 23.
