Mrs. Boerger and her advanced home economics class spent three class periods in

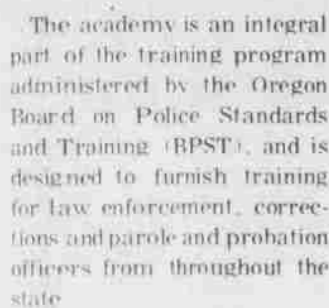
the morning preparing for the dinner. The home economics class consisted of Shirley Harris, Linda Poole, Janet Hams, and Lisa Meyers.
