

Bier, Sherer lead Heppner JV to overtime upset win over Riverside

Robert Bier scored 18 points making 8 of 11 shots from the field to lead the Heppner JV team to a 56-53 overtime win over the Riverside Pirates.

Brett Sherer sank one free throw in the last minute of the game to tie the score at 53-53 and send the game into overtime. He then sank three free throws in the overtime period as the Mustangs held Riverside scoreless and went on to win.

"Brett is the team leader and he seems to play well in tough situations," an excited Coach Brent Eggars said after the game. "He always gives you 100 percent hustle and his positive attitude rubs off on the rest of the team."

"I could never be more proud of a team in my life. I was by far the best game of the season for us. The kid overcame adversity the entire game and just would not quit. Nobody had a bad game for us. The Riverside coach came into our locker room after the game and said we were the best team he has seen all year. This was a team win all the way."

The team played the game without its leading scorer Ker Stookey, who broke his hand prior to the Condon game last Tuesday. Bier sprained his

ankle and had to go out of the game in the first minute of the overtime. Another leading scorer, Greg Sweeney, fouled out of the game in the fourth quarter.

Riverside finished the season with a 12-2 record. The Pirates beat Heppner a week earlier 70-54. Heppner shot .581 from the field making 25-of-43 while

Riverside made 24-of-53 for .453 percent. Don Lott had nine assists in the game and Brian Thompson had four steals and six rebounds. Sherer finished the game

with 12 points. Sweeney had 10, Thompson 8, Lott 4 and Earl Hammond scored 4 points. Heppner JVs also beat Condon last week 75-36 with

Bier again leading the scoring with 18 points as he made an amazing 9-of-10 shots from the floor. Sweeney had 11 points, Sherer 10, Joe Struthers 8,

Lott 7, Hammond 6, Joe Mollahan 5, Thompson 4, Kelly Crewse 3 and Harry Groshens 3. Hammond had 10 rebounds, Lott had four assists and

Sherer had four steals. The team plays at Pilot Rock tomorrow at 4:30 p.m. and at home Saturday against Weston-McEwen in another 4:30 game.
