

Ione's Beecher's Tavern robbed of liquor, road explosives stolen from state department

A robbery at Beecher's Tavern in Ione and the theft of some dangerous explosives from the state highway department are two of the cases the Morrow County Sheriff's

department has been working on this week. An 18-year-old from Umatilla, Derrick Miles, was arrested Feb. 22 in connection with the burglary of the

Beecher's Cafe and Tavern. He was arrested for two counts of burglary and one count of first degree theft. Gale Gray, Box 93 in Ione, reported that someone had

pried open the front door to get into the building. Missing were approximately 67 bottles of different types of liquor with a value of more than \$500. Also taken were a revolver,

gun shells and some candy bars. George Siler, 712 S. E. Isaac in Pendleton, reported that two padlocks were cut with bolt cutters so someone could

get in to the explosives trailer at the Oregon State Highway Dept. between Lexington and Heppner on Highway 74. Taken were 28 50-pound bags of Oxidizer Anfo explo-

sives, five boxes of Tovex explosives, 11 boxes and 15 sticks of Trimtex explosives, three rolls of TOV-A71 explosives, 300 feet of primer cord and 500 explosive delay caps.

In other sheriff's news, Paul Francis Van Marter, 255 W. Baltimore in Heppner, was arrested and then released on \$500 bail for manufacturing a controlled substance and possession of a controlled substance.

A warrant for the arrest of Paul Robert Huff was put out in connection with the Beecher's Tavern burglary. The warrant is for burglary in the second degree and first degree theft.

Robert Gene McKee was cited for possession of less than one ounce of marijuana.

Two 15-year-old male juveniles in Irrigon were handed over to juvenile court for criminal mischief, Rose Foster, Irrigon Mobile Ct. No. 3, reported that her two young neighbors were throwing rocks and pounding their fists against her mobile home.

A warrant has been put out for the arrest of John Leonard Moin of Boardman for burglary in the first degree and menacing. Bail has been set at \$10,000.

Francisco G. Sanchez, Irrigon Trailer Ct. A-3, was cited for driving while under the influence of intoxicants.

Bob Harris of Heppner reported that some of his guns were missing.
