Heppner and Ione High Schools have another full slate of athletic events scheduled for the next week.

The Heppner varsity baseball team travels to Pilot Rock Saturday to play in an invitational with the first of two games scheduled at 10:30 a.m.

Heppner's track team will participate in the Condon Invitational Saturday at 11 a.m. in Condon with both boys and girls competing.

The JV baseball team plays at Boardman against Riverside High School at 4 p.m. Monday.

Next Tuesday the boys and girls track teams will compete with teams from Umatilla, Ione, Stanfield and Riverside in a 4 p.m. meet in Umatilla.

That same day the varsity baseball team will play Riverside in Heppner with a starting time of 4 p.m.

Heppner's varsity golf team will have its first home match of the year April 9 with the boys and girls competing against Umatilla at 1:30 p.m.

The Ione track team for both boys and girls will compete Saturday at Condon with the meet scheduled to begin at 11 a.m.

Riverside's Wilson tosses no-hitter at Heppner

Only two weeks after Lerry Wilson led Riverside High School to the State Class A basketball title he is already in top form on the baseball field as he pitched a no hitter against Heppner High School Monday night in Boardman.

Riverside won the game 2-1 with Riverside getting three hits and committing four errors and Heppner having three errors.

Heppner's only run came in the first inning when Dale Holland walked, Doug Holland walked, John Bier got on base on an error and Tim Hedman walked to force in a run.

Riverside got its two runs in the third inning on a walk, an error and a triple by McKenzie.

Wilson pitched a complete seven-inning game striking out nine and walking three. Doug Holland started for Heppner and pitched five innings walking five and striking out six while giving up three hits. Bier came in to pitch in the sixth inning with the bases loaded and no outs but he got out of the jam with a pop up and a double play.

Heppner had a chance to tie the game in the sixth inning when Doug Holland got on second base after a two-base error but he was thrown out at the plate after trying to sneak in after a bunt by John Murray.

"We played a super ball game against a strong club,"

Coach Dale Holland said.

Heppner lost to Weston-McEwen Saturday in Heppner 9-1 with a second game canceled because of bad weather.

Weston McEwen dominated the game with the highlight for Heppner coming in the fourth inning when Dale Holland came in with the bases loaded and no outs to pitch. The batter hit a shot to left field and shortstop Doug Holland made a great catch and Heppner then doubled off two base runners for a triple play.

"It was only the second one I ever saw," Coach Holland said.

Heppner scored in the third inning when Dale Holland

walked and scored after two errors.

Heppner had the bases loaded in the fifth inning but could not score.

The only Mustang hits in the game were infield singles by Rick Cole and John Murray. Weston-McEwen had nine

runs on 14 hits and two errors.

Heppner had one run on two hits and three errors. Tiger-Scot pitcher Ken Devereaux was the winner throwing for five innings giving up three walks and striking out nine. Bier was the loser for Heppner pitching three innings and

Dale Holland also pitched three and Cole threw for one inning.

Heppner will play in the Pilot Rock Invitational Saturday playing Wallowa at 10:30 a.m. and will play at 1 p.m. if the team loses and 3 p.m. if it wins.
