

Pendleton Hospital denied expansion grant

Richard H. Grant, director of the State Health Planning and Development Agency, recently denied a \$16.8 million proposal by St. Anthony Hospital in Pendleton to reorganize and expand its facility.

The project was to include the construction of a new wing and remodeling of the 1961 building. The actual project construction cost was estimated to be \$6,057,000. Financing charges over a 30-year period were estimated at \$10,810,000.

ESTABLISHING A NEW TAX BASE QUESTION

SHALL THE CITY OF IONE BE AUTHORIZED TO INCREASE ITS TAX BASE FROM \$7.157 TO \$11.157 FOR FISCAL YEAR 1980-1981?

PURPOSE:

Article XI, Section II of the Oregon Constitution limits taxing power of Cities. Once a tax base is established, Ione can levy that amount with a 4 percent per year increase without voter approval. The \$11.157 base becomes effective in fiscal year 1980-81. The previous tax base was \$7.157. Reason for the increase is, increased costs in audits, street lighting and maintenance, insurance and wages.

EXPLANATION:

The current tax base for the City of Ione is \$7.157 and the City is proposing a new base of \$11.157. Currently the City provides water service, street maintenance and lighting services, and other important services to residents. Increased maintenance, electricity, wages, insurance, and audit costs are the reason for the new base. Also a ten year serial levy of \$4,000 will expire in June 1980 and Ione tax payers will no longer be paying on this obligation. The new tax base amount will be partially financed by the State, but the City requires additional property tax revenue to operate. Oregon Constitutional limitations require voter approval of any City tax levy over the tax base plus an allowable 6 percent increase per year. Any new tax base must be submitted for voter approval.

SPECIAL ELECTION TO APPROVE TAX LEVY OUTSIDE SIX PERCENT LIMITATION

Shall the voters authorize Morrow County to levy \$1,330,139 outside the six percent limitation to balance the 1980-81 operating budget?

The purpose of this measure is to provide funds to balance the county's operating budget for fiscal year 1980-81.

EXPLANATION OF PROPOSAL:

The total proposed FY 1980-81 county budget to provide the level of county services approved by the budget committee is \$4,362,484. That figure includes roads, hospital, and all other county budgeted items except the animal control fund, which is the subject of a separate ballot. The resources to balance the budget come from many sources, including federal and state payments and the local property tax levy. A total property tax levy of \$1,893,129 is necessary to balance the budget. This total includes \$367,990 the county's tax base, the \$195,000 road serial levy, and the \$1,330,139 additional, for which voter approval is sought in this election. If this measure is approved, \$1,893,129 (i.e., all) of the taxes levied will be financed partially by the State of Oregon which will result in an estimated tax rate of \$3.57 per \$1,000 of true cash value.

SPECIAL ELECTION TO APPROVE TAX LEVY OUTSIDE SIX PERCENT LIMITATION

Shall the voters authorize Morrow County to levy \$27,493 outside the six percent limitation for animal control operations?

EXPLANATION OF PROPOSAL:

Morrow County has been petitioned to provide animal control services on a county-wide basis. The service would be focused primarily on dog control and would be available both inside and outside cities. A total animal control budget of \$51,957 is contemplated. This budget would be partially funded by fees, fines and revenue sharing funds. The proposed property tax levy of \$27,493 is needed to balance this budget. If this measure is approved, \$27,493 (i.e., all) of the tax levied will be financed partially by the State of Oregon which will result in an estimated tax rate of \$0.04 per \$1,000 of true cash value.
