

Cardinal boys team captures invitational

Depth proved to be the deciding factor as lone captured only three first places in the Umatilla Invitational last week but managed to come up with 195 team points to easily beat Heppner, who was second with 98.

Dennis Stefani was first in the long jump at 19-6½. Robin LaRue first in the 110 high hurdles with a time of 16.8 seconds and the 400 meter relay team of Duane Fetsch, Gregg Rietmann, Treve Peterson and Robin LaRue was first with a time of 46.9 seconds.

Terry Starr was second in the shot put at 40-1¼ and second in the discus at 129-9. Shawn LaRue was second in

the high jump with 5-8 and was second in the 800 meters at 2:18.9. Jerry Rietmann was second in the pole vault at 10-6. Mike Conklin was second in the 110 high hurdles with a time of 18.2 seconds and Treve Peterson was second in the 100 meters with a 11.5 clocking.

Jim McCabe was third in the 400 meters at 56.9. Thompson third in the pole vault at 10 feet. Stefani was third in the triple jump with a leap of 38-10. Francis Doherty shot a hole-in-one on Willow Creek Country club hole No. 17 to highlight men's Sunday morning play April 13.

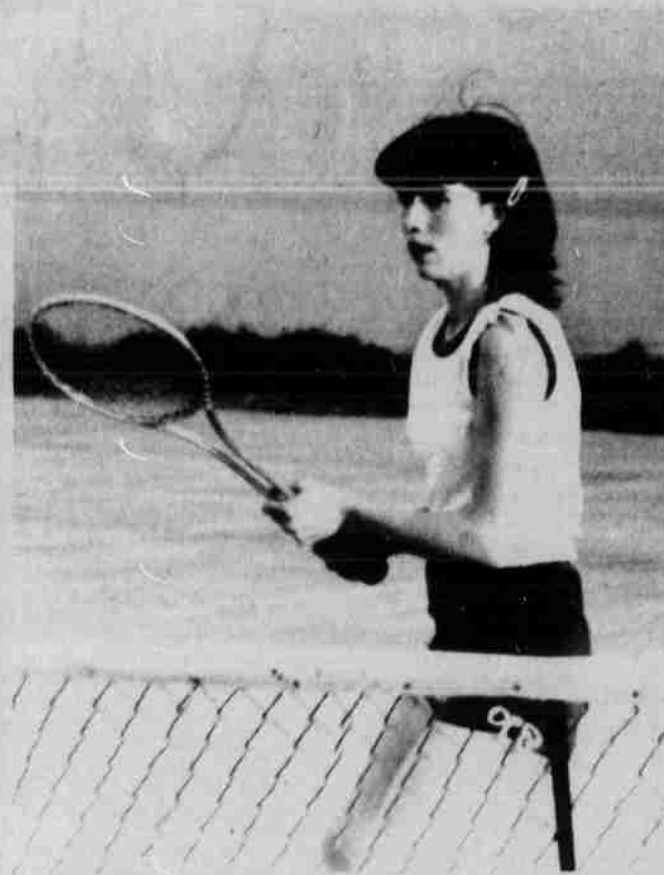
It was his fifth ace on the Heppner course.

Heppner second at track meet

Heppner's boys track team came in second place in the Umatilla Invitational last week with 98 team points with only lone ahead of the Mustangs with 195.

Jim Parker led the track-

sters with first place finishes in the shot put, with a toss of 48-8½, and discus, with a distance of 133-10, and a second place finish in the triple jump, with a jump of 39-9.

Todd Sherer was first in the 400 meters with a time of 54.9 seconds and also first in the 800 meters with a time of 2:09.8.

Heppner showed its power in the long-distance race, the 1500 meters, as the Mustangs had the top three finishers. Larry Palmer was first at 4:37.2, Dan Nix was second at 4:41 and Jari Alasuvanto third at 4:51.

Alasuvanto was third in the 800 meters with a tie of 2:24.5 and Jones was third in the 200 meters with a time of 25.3 seconds.

Heppner's 400 meter relay team was third with a time of 48.9 seconds.

Umatilla was third in the team standings with 82 team points. Riverside was fourth with 69 and Stanfield last with 14.
