Former Representative challenges Packwood

Former U.S. Rep. Charles O. Porter, a Eugene attorney, has filed for the Democratic nomination for the U.S. Senate seat held by Sen. Bob Packwood, Republican.

Porter served two terms in Congress, 1957-1961, and as a Food for Peace consultant on President John F. Kennedy's White House staff in 1961. He is 60 years old.

For his primary election opponent, State Sen. Ted Kulonski of Lane County. Porter had only praise.

"Our campaigns during the primary will help the winner gain momentum," he said. "Ted is a fine person, who agrees with me that the Democratic voters, to fully realize their strength, need a choice, a contest."

Porter renewed his pledge, made in all of his campaigns for Congress, to spend one-third of his time "working for peace."

Portland sewage sludge discussed at chamber

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Toadvin said Morrow County Commissioner Dorothy Krebs appeared at the last port meeting Thursday and said the county court is against the sludge proposal and she gave a report on sludge contamination.

The Portland sludge is from a sewage treatment plant for industries that dumps heavy

poisonous metals in the sewer system. Toadvin said the heavy metals can be removed but the equipment needed is very expensive.

Toadvin said pre-treatment restrictions on waste that enters the sewage treatment plant before it is turned into sludge is the best way to be sure the sludge is safe.

A proposal by Portland engineer George Ward made last week said the sludge would go "hand in glove" with the new alcohol plant that is being proposed.

Ward said the sludge would help corn to grow and the corn could be used in the alcohol plant.

Toadvin said he asked Ward five times if he could guarantee that the industrial sludge would not contaminate the groundwater if it was dumped on port land and Ward said he could not guarantee anything.

"Portland does have a real problem," Toadvin said. "We still do not have any idea how much money the sludge would bring to the county or what it will do for us."

Another prospective sludge tenant, J.M. Docken, has reserved 38 acres of port land to use as a sludge disposal site but Toadvin said it is just reserved and has not been leased.

"If sludge does come to Morrow County, the Port of Morrow will be involved," Toadvin said.

After the meeting, Toadvin said the Port of Morrow budget is nearing completion and the port commissioners are making sure they stay within the six percent limitation so it will not have to be voted on by the voters. This year, property taxes paid for about \$40,000 of a \$500,000 operating budget.

Health Education Programs are presented at no charge.

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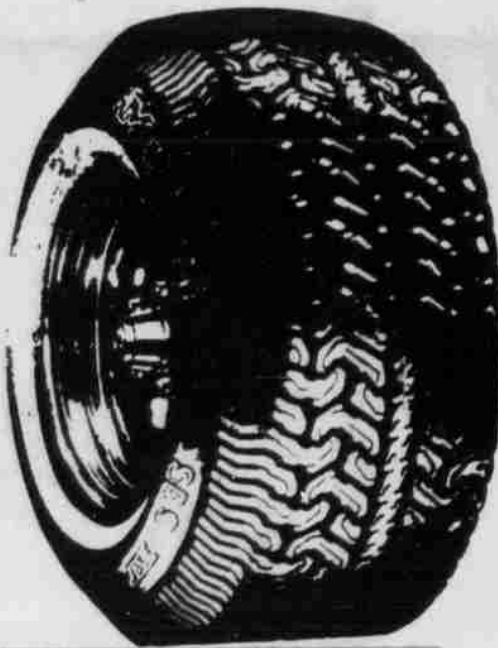
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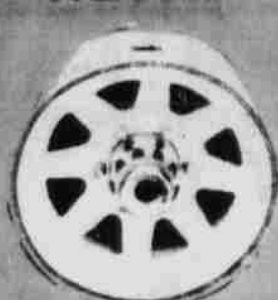
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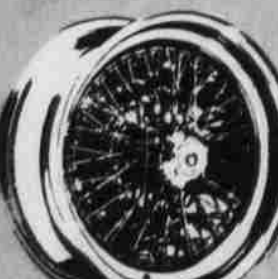
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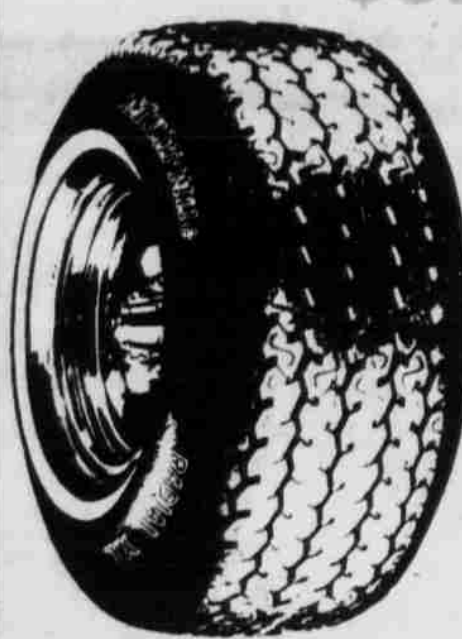


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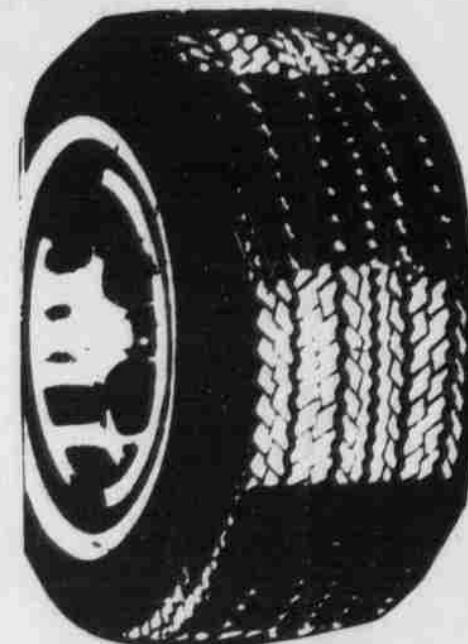
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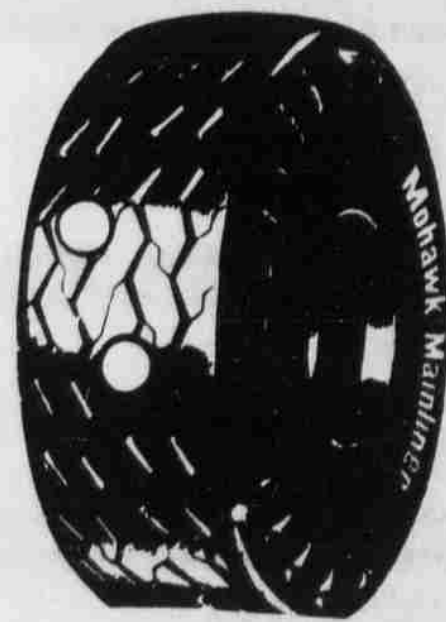
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
