Fillies tracksters win 3; Condon's Greiner improves state marks

Heppner girls track team edged Ione 73 to 71 in a home track meet last week.

Condon was third with 41 and Ukiah fourth with 34 team points.

In the closest race of the day Meg Greiner of Condon improved her Oregon state record in the 100 meter dash to 12.5 seconds. Kim Pettyjohn was second for Ione in 12.8 seconds.

Greiner also improved her state best record in the long jump with a leap of 17 feet. Pettyjohn was second, Margaret Doherty third and Lisa Meyers fifth.

Kellie Hammond won the javelin toss with a throw of 107-8. Cindy Hill was second.

Michelle LaRue third and Bonnie Arrington fourth.

Mary Kincaid was first in the high jump at 4-6, Suzie Jacobs second, Hammond third and Hill fourth.

Hammond finished first in the discus at 83-10, Sherry Clement was second, Vicki Smith third, Arrington fourth and Diane Morter fifth.

Ione won the 400 meter relay in 57.19 seconds with Ukiah just edging Heppner for second place.

Meyers was second in the 1500 meter run, Lisa Wilson was third, and Paula Palmer fifth.

Margaret Kincaid finished second in the shot put with a throw of 26-7. Clement was

second, Patti Taylor third and Jacobs fifth.

Doherty won the 400 meters in 1:03.9 with Hill placing third and Palmer fourth.

Margaret Kincaid placed third in the 100 meter hurdles with Taylor fourth and Kim Miller fifth.

Morter won the 800 meters in 3:04.84 with Forwood placing second.

Pettyjohn came in first place in the 200 meter dash with a time of 26.79. Doherty was second at 27.26.

Margaret Kincaid won the 300 meter hurdles in 59.17 seconds with Taylor second and Morter fourth.

Wilson was second in the 3,000 meters and Palmer fourth.

Starr, La Rue lead Cards to Big Sky track title

Terry Starr scored wins in the javelin and discus and Robin LaRue finished first in the 110 high hurdles and the 300 meter intermediate hurdles leading the Ione Cardinals boys track team to the Big Sky Conference Track and Field Meet title in Arlington Saturday.

Starr tossed the javelin 132-1 and the discus 120-9. Jim McCabe was second in the javelin and Craig Gutierrez third. Denny Starr was fourth in the discus for Ione.

LaRue won the 110 hurdles in 17.1 seconds with teammates Mike Conklin second and Shawn LaRue fourth. Robin LaRue also won the 300 hurdles in 43.2 seconds. Les Thompson finished second and Conklin third.

Other first place finishes for Ione had Duane Fetsch winning the 100 meter dash in 12.2 seconds and Gregg Rietmann winning the 200 meters in 25 seconds. The 1600 relay team of McCabe, Fetsch, Thompson and LaRue was first in 3:47 and the 400 meter relay team

of Fetsch, Jeff Hams, LaRue and Rietmann was first in 47.1 seconds.

McCabe was second in the 200 and Fetsch third. Hams was second in the 100 meters and Conklin tied for fifth.

Hams was second in the long jump at 16-10 and Jerry

Rietmann won the pole vault with an 11 foot vault. Thompson was second in the pole vault. Gregg Rietmann was third in the long jump.

Starr placed second in the shot put at 41-11 and Gutierrez was fourth. Thompson was second in the high jump at 5-8 and Shawn LaRue fifth. Shawn LaRue was third in the 1500 meters with a time of 4:48.5.

McCabe was second in the 400 meters with a 55.5 second

clocking and Hams was fourth. Gregg Rietmann finished second in the triple jump with a leap of 34.4 and Jerry Rietmann was third. Shawn LaRue was fifth in the 800 meters and Larry Snider third in the 3,000 meters with a clocking of 10:45.5.

Ione won the meet with 241½ points with Arlington second with 103, Helix third with 82, Dufur fourth with 77½ and Echo last with 0.
