

# Automatic smoke detectors required July 1

Automatic smoke detectors will be required in Oregon after July 1 in all rental units used for sleeping purposes. It will be up to the tenants to see that the detectors are provided.

Clyde W. Centers, state fire marshal, said there are not enough men available in fire departments to enforce the new law.

"It is the responsibility of the landlord that the dwelling unit be equipped with a functioning smoke detector and that the tenant be provided with written instructions for testing the device."

## Easter Seal camp to aid handicapped

Physically disabled children and adults from throughout Oregon who want to swim, fish, ride horseback and otherwise enjoy a session at Camp Easter Seal this summer should write soon for applications.

Camp Director Kay Stratton says that application forms will be mailed in late April to prospective campers, and will be processed in the order they are returned. The 1980 camp sessions are scheduled as follows:

Session I (7-10 year olds)—June 22-28; Session II (11-14 year olds)—July 2-11; Session III (22 years and older)—July 15-24; Session IV (Special focus)—July 28-August 6 and Session V (15-21 years)—August 16-19.

In addition to openings for approximately 240 campers, summer 1980 openings also exist for volunteer camp staff members. Volunteers, aged 14 and older, may work either as kitchen aides or as cabin aides, and can sign up for one or more sessions. Persons interested in receiving application forms or in volunteering for the camp staff should write: Camp Easter Seal, The Easter Seal Society, 5757 S.W. Macadam Ave., Portland, OR 97201.

Camp Easter Seal, located on a timbered site with wheelchair-accessible camping activities and facilities, is among services provided by the Easter Seal Society for Crippled Children and Adults of Oregon to persons with physical disabilities. Camp Easter Seal itself is maintained primarily by contributions to the annual Easter Seal Appeal, now underway; operating expenses are offset by camper fees and camperships provided by interested groups and individuals.

If the premises do not contain a smoke detector within 10 days after a complaint has been filed with the

landlord, the tenant should advise the local fire chief or state fire marshal.

"The maximum penalty for failure to comply is \$250," Centers said.

The law also requires that smoke detectors be installed in owner occupied dwellings upon change of ownership after July 1. This is enforceable by the purchaser.

Centers said that 52 persons died in residential fires in Oregon last year, and that many of these deaths would

not have occurred if there had been smoke detectors. The number of deaths has dropped gradually from 69 in

1975, and a large part of this reduction can be attributed to the installation of smoke detectors.

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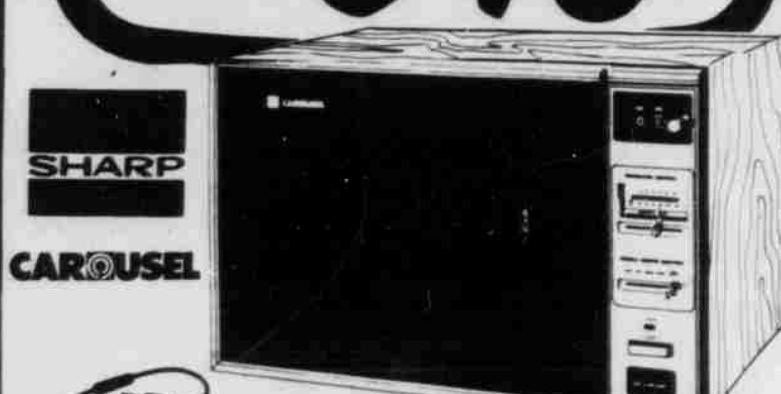
