

Ione wins 5 medals at state meet

Kim Pettyjohn placed third in the 200 meters and fourth in the 100 meters and team-mate Margaret Doherty was third in the 400 meters for the Ione girls track team at the State A Track Meet last

weekend at the Lewis and Clark Track in Portland. The boys team was led by the 400 meter relay team, which placed fourth, and Gregg Rietmann in the 200 meters, who placed sixth.

Pettyjohn won a third place state medal in the 200 meters with a time of 26.7 seconds. She was fourth in the 100 meters final with a time of 12.9 seconds. She tied the Ione school record for the 100 meters with a time of 12.6 seconds in a preliminary heat.

Doherty's third place finish in the 400 meters came in a time of 59.4 seconds. She also broke the school record in a preliminary heat with a time of 59 seconds in the 400.

The Ione girls tied for 10th place with 16 team points. Lost River won the state title for the girls title with 51 points with Warrenton second with 50.

Ione's boys relay team of Robin LaRue, Jeff Hams, Gregg Rietmann and Duane Fetsch placed fourth at state with a time of 44.85 seconds for a school record. That same relay team set the old record a

week earlier at district with a time of 45.03. Gregg Rietmann was sixth in the 200 meters with a time of 23.4 seconds. Jerry Rietmann just missed winning a medal as he pole vaulted 11-9. A vault of 12-0 would have tied him for sixth place.

Ione had five team points against the A school competition. "I was pleased," Coach Gordon Meyers said. "You had to do all right down there to get a medal as only the top six in each event get medals. Being sixth in the state is not bad."

Heppner golfers falter second day at district; finish third

Heppner's golf team was in second place in the District Golf Tournament at Canida last week after the first day of competition.

But the second day proved to be disastrous as the team let Madras tie them for second place with 686 strokes each.

That forced a nine-hole playoff since the first two teams at district go to the state Golf Tournament at the McNary course in Salem.

Heppner lost the nine-hole playoff to Madras by 15 strokes.

Mac-Hi won the tournament and will go to state along with Madras. Heppner was third

after the playoff and Grant Union fourth.

Heppner was eight strokes in front of Madras after the first day with 339 compared to 347 but the teams traded scores the second day.

Jeff Edmundson tied for the lead in the tournament at the end of the first day shooting an 80. The second day he shot an 83 but the other top golfers improved their scores and he was nudged out of an individual spot at a trip to state. He missed the cut by one stroke with his 163 for the 36 holes. The top golfer shot a 159. The top four went to state. "We were unlucky all the

way around," Coach Duane Neiffer said. "It was really odd to have two teams tie after that many strokes."

After shooting an 83 the first day, Curt Day shot a 94 the second. Mike Lott shot an 88 and 89. Playing the alternate on the second day, Dorian Forrar shot a 90.

"Everybody in the clubhouse was waiting for Dorian's score to see if we were going to win, tie or lose," Neiffer said. "There was a lot of pressure on him. After he said he shot a 90 for the tie, we had a 15 minute wait and then shot a playoff of nine holes in a thunderstorm."

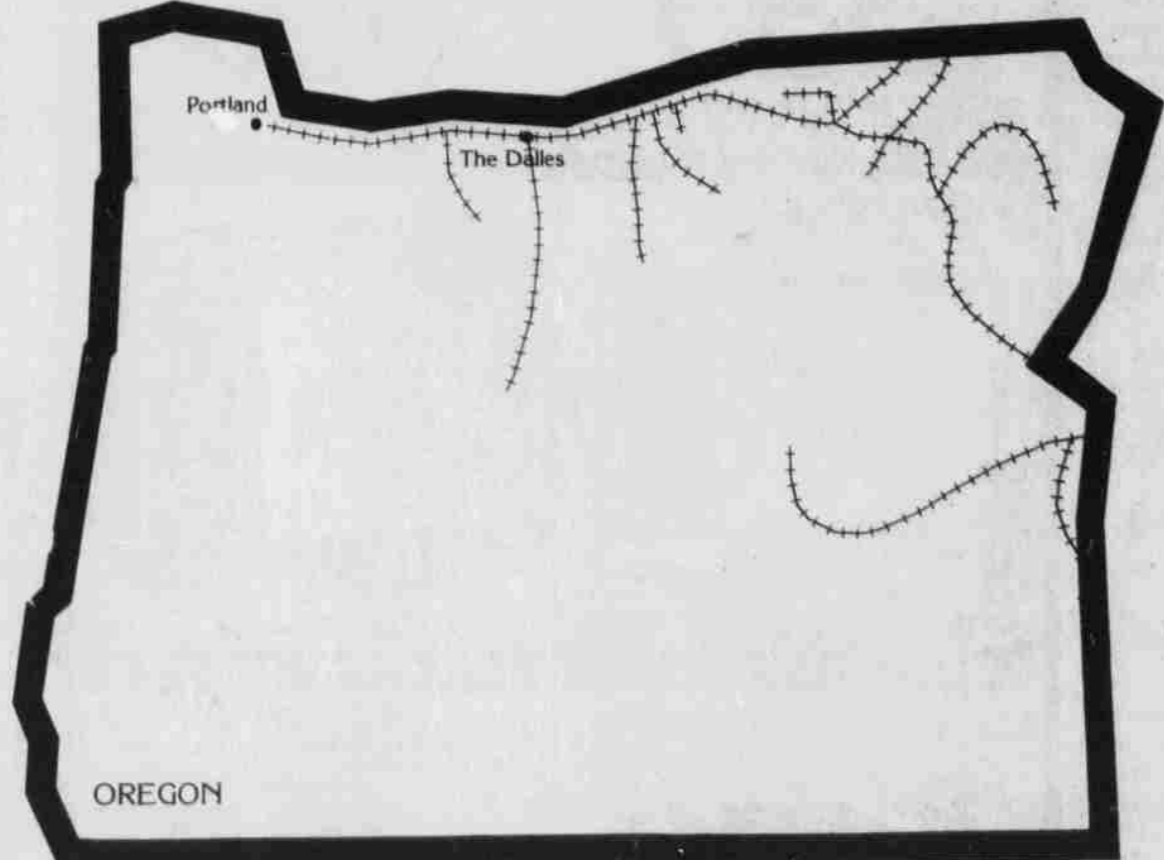
