## Bussing discussed

The need for more effective scheduling of the county senior citizens' bus, including regular trips to Hermiston and Pendleton, was discussed at the recent meeting of the Morrow County Senior Citizens' Advisory Council.

Less than a quorum attended. The session was held in the Columbia Basin Electric Co-operative Association's board room, May 27.

County Transportation Chairman Truman Messenger and member Paul Jones discussed the use of the bus. They brought up the necessity for better scheduling. It was agreed to use the bus on June 7 to transport persons from Heppner and Lexington to the community auction in lone, and on July 9, to take citizens and handicapped persons of Cutsforth Park for a noon picnic. Use of the bus for scheduled trips to nearby cities such as Hermiston and Pendleton, will be considered.

Rollin Reynolds, Pendleton, director of the Area Agency on Aging, reported that the Homemaker Program is providing fine help to seniors in the area. Its director, Sue Jepsen, had been away for a short time to attend her son's college graduation. Reynolds also reported on some changes in the Older Americans Act, on the "280 Report" Forms, and spoke of prospects for the 1981 fiscal year.

Reports were heard on the activity of the three county mealsites. It was pointed out that there are now 18 mealsites in the five-county area, because a new site at Echo is now providing meals on Wednesday noons.

Changes in the organization's by-laws were discussed and a complete voting on them will be taken through the mail. Theta Lowe reported for the Committee on Nominations, stating it was recommended that the present officers serve the council for another year.

Rollin Reynolds spoke about the need for local participation in the White House Conference on Aging at Town Hall-type of meetings. It was agreed that a meeting, which would involve representatives from this county and Gilliam and Wheeler Counties, should

be scheduled for early September and might be held at the Lexington Grange, probably on Tuesday, Sept. 9.

Incumbent Larry Fetsch will be facing Bud Englert, who won the write-in candidacy for sheriff for the Republican Party, and Doug Rathbun, Heppner city policeman who has announced his candidacy as an independent.

In the May 20 election, Englert received 188 Republican write-in votes and 112

Democratic votes. Although not officially running in the Primary, Rathbun collected 83 Republican votes and 61

Democratic votes. Fetsch got 104 votes from Republicans and he won the Democratic nomination with 760 votes as

will have an impact on the county by adding valuation to the county for tax purposes,

furnishing a new market and providing new employment. The feedlot itself is expected to employ 30 people and there will also be employment in the construction of the feedlot. Construction is expected to take from 90 to 120 days.

Simplot will build the feedlot on 50 acres. It will house 30,000 cattle on concrete slabs. The concrete will be sprayed with water that is recycled. Manure and liquid waste from the cattle will be recycled and treated and used in food for the animal and fertilizer for crops grown to feed the animals.

"Simplot hopes to make it a model showcase for all feedlots," that are built in the future, McElligott said.

In an effort to speed up the permit process, Seeger met with officials of Simplot, the Department of Commerce and the Department of Environmental Quality last Saturday.

Simplot was able to deal directly in one room with all the permit agencies which should speed up the process from three to five weeks, Seeger said.
