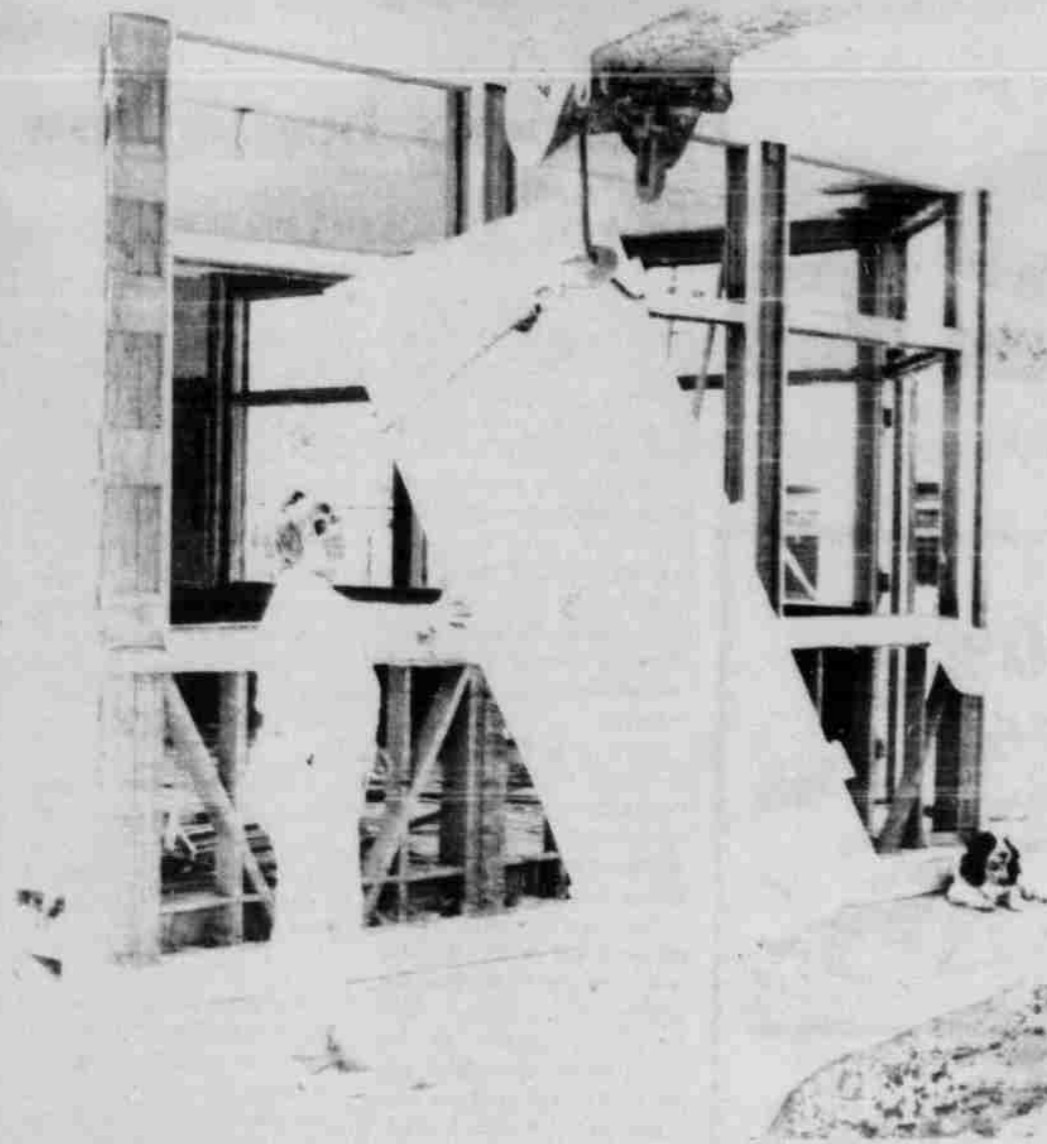


Out with the old
