One of Morrow County's 4-H clubs is know state-wide for their championship work... that's the Lexington Tole Painters club led by Phillis Piper, and Eileen and Linda Padberg.

They'll be back this year at fair...showing their skills and accomplishments, with an eye on taking the honors again at state fair.

Some of the former champions will be showing their work. They'll be joined by new talent as the three leaders expanded their club this year to take in more members and beginners.

Their club is so popular that they keep a waiting list for those wanting to join. When a member graduates, they then have room for a beginner.

What is the secret of this popular club? They seldom have members who do not show up for meetings.

Each of the three leaders spend at least one day a week preparing for thier meetings... and another day working with members. Their dedication to the program is unmatched, and the work of their members prove both their talents as teachers, and their dedication.

See the work of this talented group at Morrow County Fair, and see the three leaders too, for they again will be serving as superintendents in the 4-H annex.

The modified Danish system of placing exhibits with a rating of blue, red, or white ribbon is used in 4-H judging. All exhibits receive a ribbon. All exhibits in this approach are judged in comparison with a standard, as opposed to comparison with other exhibits in a class.

The standard for each exhibit is established by the characteristics of an "ideal" product in each category.

Blue...Excellent to superior.

Red-Good to Excellent.

White...Acceptable, but needs improvement.

Interview judging or conference judging, is carried out in all home ec, creative arts, natural science, etc. sections of the 4-H fair. This means the member has the opportunity to visit with the judge; ask any questions they wish, and receive first hand help on projects. This also allows the judge the opportunity to have a brief opportunity to find out why and how the members have accomplished the exhibit and what problems they encountered.

The member should feel comfortable in talking to judges at our fair. They are people who are interested in helping youth.

The member should be aware that the judge is there for that reason, and take advantage of the opportunity to get help from experts in that particular field.
