Fifty Years Ago

Just 50 years ago, Sept. 11, 1930, winners of the county Wool and Grain Show were announced. H. S. Lindgren, extension specialist of Oregon State College, judged the wool exhibits, and George Mitchell, superintendent of the rotation experiment station at Adams, judged the wheat.

Fourteen classes, including both the wool and wheat exhibits, made up the display. First second and third prizes of \$3.52 and \$1 were given in each class, as well as blue, red and yellow ribbons.

An official high temperature of 99 degrees, thought to be a record for this time of year, was checked on both Monday and Tuesday at the Heppner weather station.

Last Saturday's parade was one of the largest and best rodeo parades seen here. The grand sweepstakes award in the float division went to the Heppner Soroptimist Club.

Howard Bryant was judged top roper in the Morrow county amateur calf roping and received his saddle and congratulations from Paul Koenig, manager of the Heppner Pine Mills. Northwest bronc riding champion Norman Goree of Arlington received the top prize, a coveted Hamley saddle, from Ralph Schwalbe, treasurer of Hamley & Co. Pendleton saddle-makers. Goree also went home with a good share of the \$1,250 prize money for the event.
