St. Anthony Hospital in Pendleton will again present a series of monthly educational programs. These programs are made possible at no cost to the public because of contributions of time by physicians, hospital personnel and community professionals. Programs will be held in the auditorium on the first floor of St. Anthony Hospital.

Sister Helen Ann, administrator, states that by continuing to provide educational opportunities for the public, St. Anthony Hospital and its medical staff are responding to the challenge to assist individuals in promoting their own health, and preventing illness. Acceptance of responsibility for ones own personal health should result in the reduction of illness, disease and injury, thus enriching and enhancing the quality of life, she says.

This year the series will begin with the "Stop Smoking Clinic," a five day program designed to help smokers quit. The "Stop Smoking Clinic" will be held on five consecutive evenings, Sept. 28, 29, 30, and Oct. 1 and 2, from 7 to 8:30 p.m. This program will be repeated in the spring.

The "Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) Training Program" will be presented in a two-part format this year, twice during the series. The first program will be presented Nov. 12, 6:30 to 9 p.m. and

Prior to missionary appointment, the Johnstons pastored a church in Warrenton, Ore., and were associate pastors at Hermiston. The Rev. Johnston worked four years in several countries with "Youth with a Mission," an evangelism organization. He earned a B.A. degree from Northwest College in Kirkland, Wash., and also studied at the University of Nebraska, at Lincoln, Neb. He is taking postgraduate

studies at the Assemblies of God Graduate School in Springfield, Mo.
