

# Cardinals stomp Falcons, 46-26

The lone Cardinals stomped the Wheeler Falcons, 46-26. It was a chilly Thursday night but the football players didn't seem to mind, as they went into the locker room with a victory.

Second stringers got to see plenty of action, as they played every other quarter.

Ione scored six straight times before Wheeler got on the score board. Ione's first touchdown came on a 16-yard pass from Jeff Hams to Treve Peterson. The extra points were good with a Hams' pass to Jim McCabe.

The first pass the Falcons threw was intercepted by Peterson. Gregg Rietmann then scampered 25-yards for a touchdown. Shawn LaRue ran in for the extra points. The Cards now had 16 points with

seven minutes to go in the first quarter.

Peterson again intercepted a Falcon pass. The Cards moved the ball down to the 22-yard line, where Hams kicked a field goal. On the next kickoff a confused Wheeler player ran into their own end zone for a safety. This made the score 21-0.

The ball was snapped over the head of the Wheeler punter for the second safety of the game. This ended the first quarter, 23-0.

The next touchdown came on a 17-yard run by freshman Howard Leavitt. Hams kicked for the extra points, making the score 30-0.

Scott Marler then intercepted an Ione pass and ran 23 yards for a touchdown. Rob Conlee ran in for the extra

points. Wheeler scored again right before the buzzer for the half. The pass for the extra points failed. The score at Halftime was 30-14.

Wheeler scored first after the half on a 50-yard pass from Scott Asher to Mike Hanna. The extra points failed.

Rietmann had a 73-yard kick-off return for a touchdown. Hams ran in for the extra points. Richard Ladd made the next touchdown, bulging in from the nine yards out. Ladd also ran in for the extra points.

The last touchdown of the game was made by Wheeler on a 30-yard Marler run.

Wheeler had eight turnovers, four interceptions and four fumbles. Peterson had three interceptions, and Darrel Colvard had one. Craig

Guerez, Vince McElligott, Barney Rea, and Tim Key all had one fumble recovery. Ione had two turnovers, both interceptions.

Ione had 270 yards rushing with Rietmann having 82 yards. They completed 14 of 26 passes for 163 yards. Wheeler had 261 yards rushing, and were 8 for 27 passing for 157 yards.

Ione's next game will be Friday, Oct. 17, against Dufur at Ione beginning at 7:30 p.m. This game will be Ione's homecoming. The homecoming princesses and queen will be crowned at halftime.

Ione had a J.V. football game on Monday, Oct. 6, against Umatilla at Ione. Ione won, 48-16. This gave the second stringers a chance to get plenty of action.

# Mustangs come away with convincing win over Vikings

The Heppner Mustangs traveled to Umatilla to play the Umatilla Vikings last Friday, and came away with a convincing 35-19 victory, which keeps the Mustangs tied for first in the Columbia Basin conference.

Heppner started the game in control of their offense, when Earl Hammond took a hand off and ran straight up the middle for six points. Doug Holland missed the extra-point-kick attempt and the Mustangs went up, 6-0.

The Vikings were fired up against the Mustangs, but to no avail, as the Heppner defense shut down the Umatilla attack, including a fine defensive play by Lee Rice who broke up a Viking pass play.

As against Sherman last week, the Mustangs went to the air against Umatilla, and on Heppner's second possession, quarterback John Bier completed a 23-yard pass to Tony Currin.

On the next play Bier rushed for 4 yards. It was then third down and Brett Sherer ran 12 yards along the sideline, not enough for the first down, however.

On fourth down Heppner went for it and Hammond scored the touchdown. Holland kicked the extra point and the first quarter ended, 13-0, in favor of the Mustangs.

Things got tough for Heppner in the second quarter. With six minutes left in the half, Umatilla made a touchdown, missed the extra point, and kicked off to the Mustangs.

Heppner took the ball and quarterback Bier tried a pass. It was intercepted by Umatilla

and the Vikings ran the ball in for the score. With the extra point attempt good, the game was knotted at 13-13.

Undaunted, the Mustangs came back throwing, and Bier tossed a 15-yard pass to Hammond, good for the go-ahead touchdown.

Heppner then showed its expertise in ball handling by setting up for an extra point kick attempt, and faking Bier threw to Currin for two points, making the score 21-13 at the end of the first half.

The third quarter saw Heppner take control of the game, starting with a 55-yard run by Bier straight up the middle.

The very next play Hammond scored on a run to make the score 27-13. Heppner set up to kick the extra point and again fooled the Vikings, this time on a pitchout to Holland who ran the ball in for two points upping the score to 29-13.

Rounding out the scoring, in the fourth quarter Sherer scored, making it 35-13. Then Umatilla came right back to put six more on the board, making the final score 35-19 in favor of the Mustangs.

One down spot in the game was Heppner's inability to hang on to the ball. The Mustangs fumbled four times prompting Coach Sporseen to say, "that hurts when that happens."

Umatilla's head coach had some praise for the Mustang defense, saying, "The defense was pretty tough, but if our team was more experienced I'm sure we could have broken it."

The next game for the Mustangs is Friday at home against Wahtonka; game time is 8 p.m.
