How practical is solar energy? Can we harness wind power for home use? Will gasohol relieve our dependence on Arab oil?

These questions and more will be addressed at the American Association of University Women (AAUW) sponsored Energy Fair to be

held Wednesday, Nov. 12, at 7:30 p.m. in the Heppner High School Cafeteria.

Participants include: David Burns of the East Oregon Solar Group; Rod Aho of the Bonneville Power Administration, who will speak on wind power; Corrine Lindsay, who will speak on gasohol and other alcohol fuels; Harry Kennison of Kinzua, who will speak on the proposed wood waste generating plant; Paul Sumner of Columbia Basin Electric Coop., who will encourage conservation; and Gene Rietmann, who will tell about windmills currently in Morrow County.

Following ten-minute presentations by each participant, there will be a refreshment period during which the audience will be invited to write down questions to be asked of the participants during the second portion of the program.

The Energy Fair is open to the public free of charge and all are encouraged to attend. AAUW members are asked

to be at the high school at 7 p.m. for a short meeting.

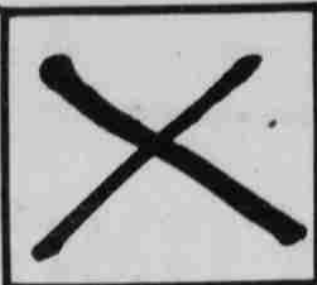

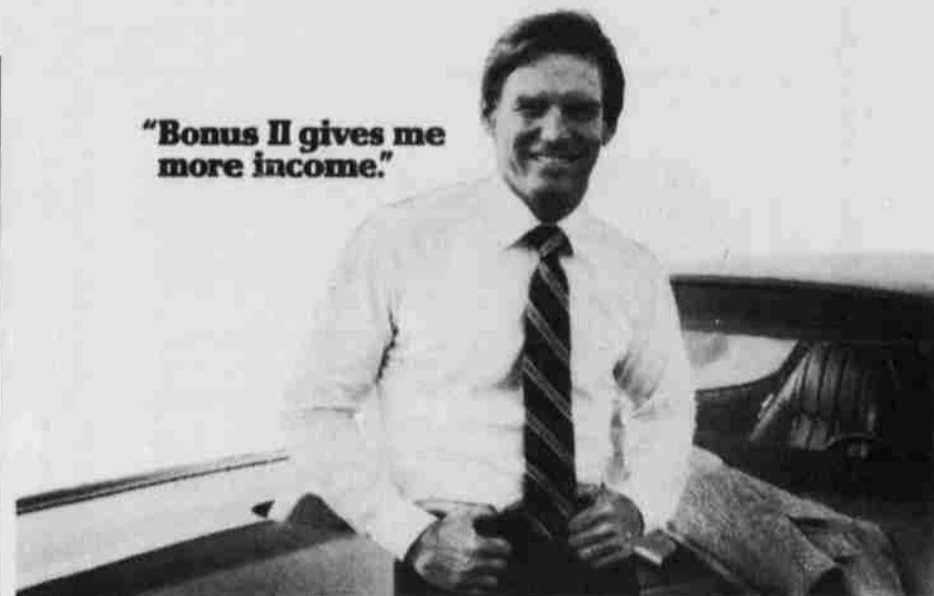
They visited the state capital building and the palace where the Hawaiian king lived long ago. They all went on several tours with the tour group seeing much of the Island of Oahu.
