

# Cards defeated by Mustangs Lone girls' basketball team meets defeat

After a week of practice the lone varsity boys opened their season against the Heppner Mustangs. The Cards were defeated 34-42.

The Mustangs outscored the Cardinals, 6-11, in the first quarter. The second quarter was evenly matched as both teams scored 9 points each. Heppner had a 5-point lead going into the locker room at half time.

The Cardinals were outscored in the third quarter, 8-15. In the fourth quarter the Cardinals looked as if they might threaten to take the

lead as they outscored the Mustangs, 11-7. The final score was 34-42.

High scorer for the Cardinals was Mark Patton with 8 points. Others scoring for the Cards were Les Thompson with 6, and Jim McCabe, 5. Treve Peterson and Jeff Hams both had 4, and Ralph Morter 3. Shawn LaRue and Tim Patton each had 2 points.

Mark Patton pulled down 12 offensive rebounds and 5 defensive boards for the Cards. Lone had 39 rebounds in all. Heppner pulled down two more as they had 41.

Both teams had 24 turnovers with both teams making early season mistakes. The Cardinals

shot 24 percent from the floor while Heppner shot 29 percent. The Cards shot 6 for 15 for 40 percent from the free throw line, the Mustangs shot 10 for 18 for 56 percent.

Coach LaRue's comment on the game was, "We weren't really prepared for the game. We couldn't seem to make any points and this made us frustrated and caused us to make mistakes we wouldn't normally have made."

Lone's next game will be Friday, December 12, at Umatilla. On Saturday the Cards travel to Mt. Vernon; both games will start after the girls games, probably around 7:30 or 8 p.m.

The lone girls opened their basketball season as they traveled to Riverside on Tuesday, Dec. 2. Saturday the Cardinals traveled to Heppner.

On Tuesday the Cards were defeated, 32-45. Starters for the Cardinals were Margaret Doherty, Tammy Holtz, Michelle LaRue, Liz McElligott, and Anita Palmer.

The Cards opened the scoring for the game as LaRue was fouled on an attempted shot. She went to the free throw line for two points. The score at the end of the first quarter was 8-11 in the Pirates

favor. The second quarter was closely matched as both teams scored 8 points apiece. This gave the Pirates a 3-point advantage as they went to the locker room.

As the teams came onto the floor for the third quarter it seemed that the Pirates wanted to play with six people. The crowd seemed especially loud, but the players didn't seem to notice until the score keepers brought it to their attention. A technical foul was called. The shot was made, and this brought the Cardinals within two points of the Pirates. The Cards couldn't seem to keep up and the third quarter ended with the Cards down, 22-34.

The Cards were outscored by one point in the last quarter. The final score was 32-45.

High scorer for the Cardinals was LaRue with 15, followed by Tammy Holtz with

10. Other scorers were Sandra Thompson with 5 and Anita Palmer with two.

High scorer for Riverside was Karen Harding with 15. Vickie Bartlett followed with 9. Others scoring were Susan Fuller, 8. Jennifer Wade, 6. Janet Hodson, 3, and Lori Russell and Sue Stubblefield with 2 each.

Holtz led the Cardinals in rebounds as she pulled down 11. The Cardinals shot 25 percent from the floor and 40 percent from the line.

On Saturday, Dec. 6, the Cards played Heppner. The Cards were defeated, 16-62.

The Cardinal girls did a good job defending the Mustangs in the first quarter, allowing them to get only 11 points. The score at the end of the quarter was 4-11 in favor of the Mustangs.

The Mustangs outscored the Cardinals badly in the second

and third quarters. The score at the end of the third quarter was 51-8, with most of the Mustang points coming from the fast break which resulted from a full-court press.

The Cards held the Mustangs to 11 points in the last quarter. The final score was 16-62.

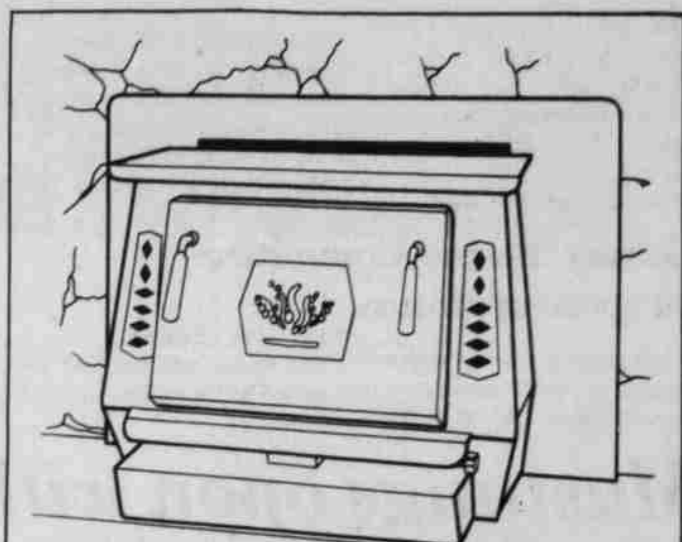
This was the first game for Heppner and they look as if they are off to a good start.
