Fifty Years Ago

The Eastern Oregon Wheat League meetings here last week were attended by more than 200 interested persons. New officers elected by the league included: president, Harry Pinkerton, Moro; vice president, James Hill, Pendleton; secretary-treasurer, C. W. Smith, Heppner; county committeemen as follows: Morrow, George Peck, Lexington; Gilliam, John Withcombe; Sherman, Dewey Thompson; Wallowa, A.G. Bernstedt; Wasco, Frank Emerson; Baker, A.V. Swift; Union, Gilbert Courtwright; Umatilla, Jens Tergerson; Jefferson, Ward Farrell.

The plan to aid unemployment as outlined by the state unemployment commission, headed by Governor Norblad, was embodied in a letter read to the Lions Club by its president, C. L. Sweek. It asked for cooperation of the counties in registering unemployed laborers, with an intention of using as many as possible on state road work.

R.L. Benge, county judge, reported on the convention of county judges and commissioners in Portland and meetings with the state highway commissioners and bureau of public roads, which has just allotted \$75,000 for 4.4 miles of grading on the Heppner-Spray road for the coming year. G. A. Bleakman, who also attended the meetings, said it is the intention of the forest people to put a right-of-way clearing crew to work on that road just as soon as weather conditions permit.

Morrow County Livestock Growers conclude annual meet. President Ed Brosnan presented Paul Hisler, Sr., and Paul Hisler, Jr., with a trophy as they were named the outstanding Livestock Growers of the Year. Approximately 125 people attended the Farm-City luncheon where a presentation was made by the Soroptimist Club to Rachel Harnett as Outstanding Woman of the Year and Virginia Whitaker and LeRoy Gardner were presented scrolls for their contribution to the city: both have remodeled their stores during the year.

Don Ostensoe, one of the meeting's speakers, brought out that approximately 10 percent of Oregon's cattle ranchers went out of business during 1975, primarily because they couldn't afford to stay in business any longer
