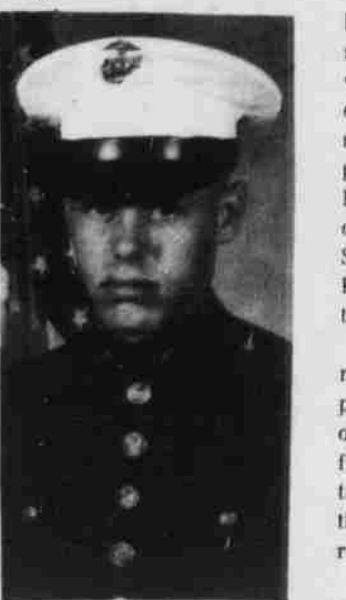
Mrs. McDaniel is retiring on Dec. 31 after 27½ years of service.
