Cow Belles, Beef Council sponsor beef cook-off

The Oregon CowBelles and Beef Council are sponsoring a 1981 Oregon Beef Microwave Cook-off.

The contest is in its seventh year, but this year the contest was changed to meet new needs and cooking habits of Oregon homes. All recipes for this cook-off must be prepared in a microwave oven.

Recipe Rules
— Cuts from the chuck round, rump, or fresh brisket, including ground beef must be used.

— A minimum of two pounds and maximum of five pounds of beef must be used.

— The meat must be exclusively beef.

— Total cooking time cannot exceed 1 1/2 hours, except marinating time.

— No commercial tenderizers are allowed.

— All entries will be judged on taste, appearance, originality and ease of preparation. Decision of the judges is final. All entries become the property of the Oregon Beef Council.

The winning recipe will be adapted to regular cooking methods for the National Cook-Off.

Contestants must be at least 18 years old. The Contest is closed to Cattlemen. Cow Belles, their immediate families, and anyone with professional food status.

To enter a microwave beef recipe, type or print the recipe on a full sheet of paper, list all ingredients in order used, do not include brand names, give complete cooking directions, indicate any special cooking accessories used, list the number of servings, and finally, mail the recipe with your name and address to: Oregon Beef Council, 400 S.W. Broadway, Portland, Ore. 97205.

Entries must be postmarked no later than February 27, 1981.

From the entries, five finalists will be chosen to compete in the Cook-Off to be held on April 4, 1981 in Portland at the Northwest Food Fair as a benefit to the Portland Art Museum.

The winner of the 1981 Oregon Beef Microwave Cook-Off will receive a microwave oven, a quarter of beef and an all-expense paid trip to the National Beef Cook-Off as Oregon's contestant.

John E. Lowe, deputy supervisor of the Willamette National Forest, Eugene, has been selected supervisor of the Umatilla National Forest, Pendleton, according to regional forester, R.E. Worthington, USDA Forest Service. Lowe succeeds Herbert B. Rudolph who retired December 29.

Effective date for Lowe to take the new position is March 8, Worthington said.

Lowe, 43, has been in his present job since September 1977. Before that he served on the White Mountain National Forest in New Hampshire, as a Job corps director on the Shawnee National Forest in Illinois, in the Eastern Regional Office of the Forest Service, Milwaukee, and on the Mark Twain National Forest. He started his Forest Service career on the Mark Twain Forest in 1963 after working for the University of Missouri, 1959-60, and in private industry, 1960-62. He is a 1959 graduate in forestry from Louisiana State University and received a master's degree from the University of Missouri in 1965.
