

# Cardinal varsity gets 2nd victory of weekend

The first quarter was pretty close but showed Ione with a 12-10 lead to start the second quarter.

# Cards take two-point win over Echo Cougars

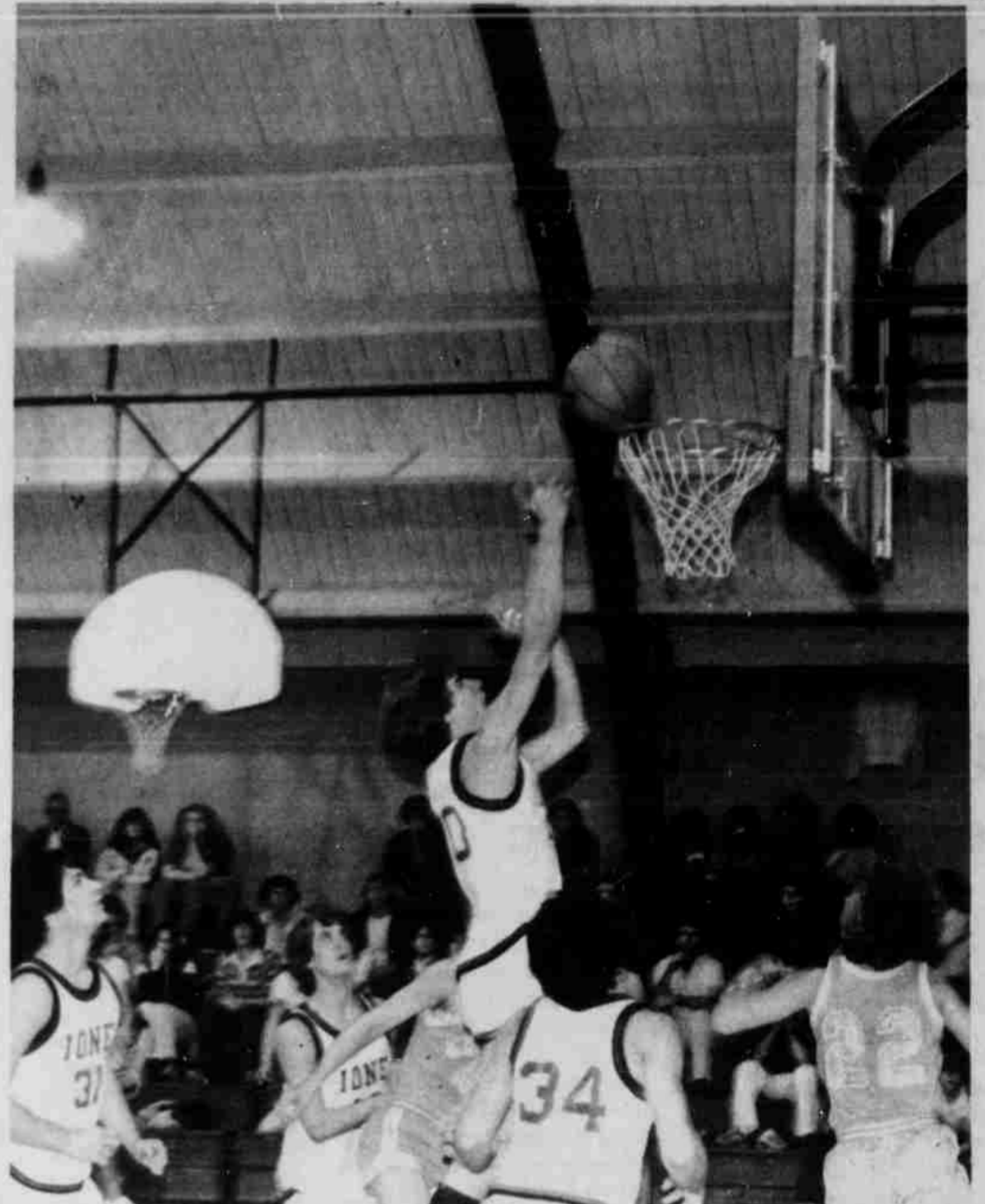

The Cards outscored Condon in the last quarter to take a 51-47 victory over Condon.

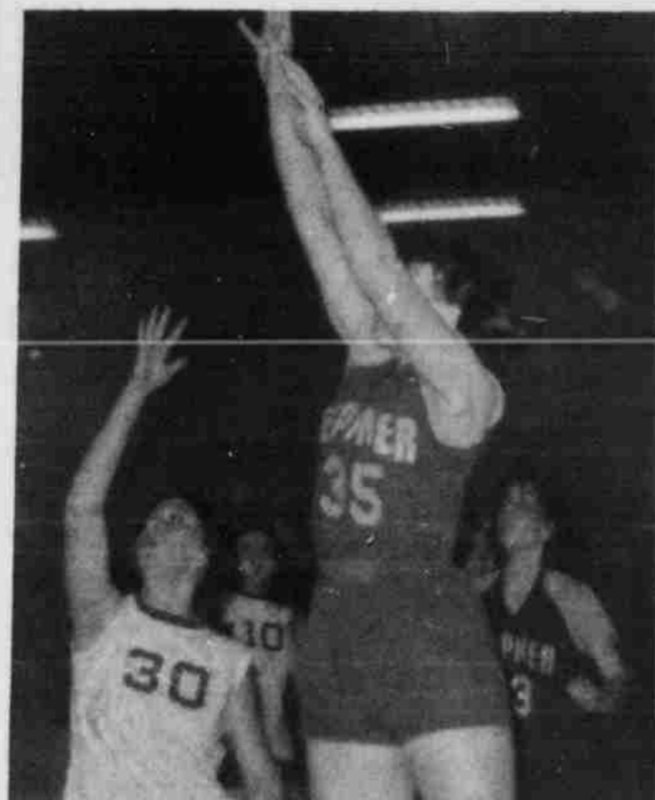
