

Mustangs surge ahead in third quarter to take Stanfield

HHS JV boys take first on-the-road win over Condon

The Heppner High boys junior varsity basketball team got its first win on the road Tuesday night, a 70-59 victory over Condon.

The Mustangs rolled to a 41-27 halftime lead and led by as many as 18 points in the fourth quarter, coasting to a win.

Mike Currin scored 17 points, Greg Connor, 14, and Jeff Orr 10 to lead Heppner. Jay Hayes tallied 9 points for the Mustangs, Marty Britt, 8, Andy Samples, 7, Harry Groshens, 4, and Shane Laughlin, 1.

Currin led Coach Brent

Eggers' rating system with a +20 rating, as he collected eight rebounds, had four assists and three steals. He was 5-for-7 from the field and 7-for-8 from the free throw line.

Connor grabbed 11 rebounds and Orr eight as Heppner owned the backboards, 44-26. Heppner shot 483 from the field (28-for-58) and 560 from the foul line (14-for-25) for the game.

Two areas that did not please Eggers were fouls and turnovers. Heppner had 29 fouls and 32 turnovers, season highs in both categories.

Condon stayed in the game by canning 24 of 40 free throws.

"This wasn't one of our better games, but it was nice to win on the road for once," said Eggers. "I was very disappointed in our defense and the lack of intelligence we used in handling the ball. Offensively, we did a lot of things well. Currin and Connor played well."

The win, Heppner's first away-from-home game, put its season record at 5-4. The Mustangs' next game is Friday, Jan. 30, when they host Umatilla.

Friday, Jan. 24, the Heppner Mustangs traveled to the Stanfield basketball gym and walked over the Stanfield Tigers, 75-52.

The Mustangs' shooting was fantastic as they missed only nine foul shots out of 32 for 69 percent from the line.

The Tigers took charge of the first quarter with a small lead with 7 field goals and one free throw shot for 15 for the quarter. The Mustangs were close behind with 5 baskets and one foul shot for 13.

As halftime approached, the Mustangs out-scored their opponents and were able to claim the second quarter by one point. They shot 7 buckets

and 3 free throws for 17 for the quarter and 30 for the half. The Tigers, however, were still in the lead with 16 points for the quarter and 31 points for the half.

In the third quarter, the Mustangs surged ahead with 6 shots good from the outside, followed up with 6 for 8 foul shots for 18 points. The Tigers scored only 3 field goals for a total of 37 to Heppner's 48.

The fourth quarter was still anybody's ball game, but the Mustangs hung in there right until the ending buzzer rang, as a slam dunk attempt by Jim Launer failed, and the score remained, Heppner, 75, to Stanfield, 52.
