Missionary to speak at Irrigon

"Looking back, I would not have chosen any other life than the challenging years of missionary work," says Assemblies of God missionary Margaret E. Carlow.

Miss Carlow will be guest speaker Wednesday, Feb. 18, at 7 p.m. at the Assembly of God Church at Irrigon, the Reverend Allen Gordanier, pastor, has announced.

Miss Carlow is an instructor in the Laymen's Bible Institute, which is a grass roots training program in the Assemblies of God of Japan. She also teaches English to medical doctors at a government hospital. Miss Carlow travels within Japan to fulfill speaking invitations.

During her past term of service, Miss Carlow has

worked with the Assemblies of God of Japan in the literature department. Her current project involves translating notes on the Bible into Japanese to be used in her Bible teaching and by Japanese ministers.

Five years of Miss Carlow's years of missionary service were spent in South Korea. She was a teacher and dean of Eternal Life College, Jeonju, Korea. Later in her career she spent two years in Hawaii in evangelistic work.

Census survey to be conducted in Morrow County Feb. 16 to 20

Local representatives of the Bureau of the Census will conduct a survey of employment in the Morrow County area during the work week of February 16-20. Dannie Martin, acting director of the bureau's regional office in Seattle, announced recently.

The survey is conducted for the U.S. Department of Labor in a scientifically designed sample of approximately 84,000 households throughout the United States. Employment and unemployment statistics based on results of this

survey are used to provide a continuing measure of the economic health of the nation.

For example, in December the survey indicated that of the 105.1 million men and women in the civilian labor force, 97.3 million were employed. The jobless rate was 7.4 percent, virtually unchanged from November.

Information supplied by people participating in the survey is kept strictly confidential by law and results are used only to compile statistical totals, says Martin.

LOC to conduct workshops for new officials

The League of Oregon Cities has announced it will conduct a series of seven, one-day workshops for newly elected officials in the state. A regional workshop will be held Saturday, Feb. 21, at the Pendleton Council Chambers, City Hall, 34 S.E. Dorion, in the conference room.

The purpose of the meetings said a League of Oregon Cities spokesperson, is to acquaint new city officials with the structure and particular needs of city government, with services of the league and various state agencies, and with other subjects of concern to municipal government. League staff members and experienced local officials will aim at hitting the key points in such topics as "The Legal Framework of City Government," "Basic City Services and Intergovernmental Relations," "Conflict of Interest and Open Meetings Law," "Land Use Planning and Management," and "Financial Management."

A special half-day training program on "Good Budgeting Practices" will be held in conjunction with the newly elected officials' workshops. Designed for city budget officers and citizen members of the budget committee, these sessions will focus on the role of the budget officer and committee and sound principles of sound city budgeting. The workshop format will include presentations based on league-prepared material as well as an opportunity for group discussion and information-sharing.

placing a wind measuring device on a steel pole, and having a private citizen responsible for reading the measurements and reporting the data to the utility. The information will be submitted to the BPA which will, in turn, determine the feasibility of the site for an electricity-producing windmill.

BPA does not necessarily plan to construct all possible windmills, however.

"This program will help people interested in generating their own electricity with a windmill find out whether they have sufficient wind to do it," said BPA Administrator Sterling Munro in announcing the project.

But he did add that "Not only will it locate places where individuals can install their own wind generators to provide their own power, but it will help refine our data on areas where utilities might locate large windmills, like the MOD-2 in wind farms, to reduce potential energy shortages in the region."

Toombs said that although the sites have already been chosen for the Columbia Basin Co-op district, the anemometers could be moved to other potential wind-generating locations in the future.
