Morrow Co. road work continues

Construction on Dick Smith McNabb West and McNabb Road continued another week, according to Morrow Co. Public Works Dept.

Road shoulders were widened with dirt and rock fill, rock walls built at culvert ends, culvert extensions were installed and more gravel was spread and bladed onto the road shoulders.

Baseling Road, Lone Boardman Road, Pointer Road, Cutsforth-Baseline, Juniper, Keck Canyon, Balm Fork Road and the road to the county landfill all had potholes patched with cold mix.

Crushed rock was spread on the Lexington Cemetery Road and the Lloyd Morgan Road.

One of the Caterpillar graders has been blading in the North end of the county doing ditching and shoulder work on old 730 Highway.

The county crusher operated as usual, said the dept.

Lone City TV Co-op to meet

The Lone City TV Co-Op will hold its annual meeting March 16 at 7:30 p.m. at the Lone School cafeteria. Election of vice president and two directors, and discussion about a monthly rate increase will take place at this meeting.

A drawing will be held for a free TV and refreshments will be served.

Since the co-op has operated at a substantial loss during 1980 - a TV cable was destroyed and had to be replaced - the board of directors has made the following amendment to the by-laws:

Persons or companies cutting television lines on public or private property shall be billed for all expenses incurred in repairing the line to its original condition.

Bids called for area projects

Bids will be received by the Oregon Transportation Commission on Thursday, March 26 for seven projects estimated to cost \$900,000. The projects include one in Morrow county, and one in Umatilla county.

The Morrow County project involves crushing and placing in three separate stockpiles approximately 15,500 cubic yards of material in the Cecil Rock Production project. It is located on the Heppner Highway, approximately five miles north of Cecil. Completion date is May 31, 1981.

The Umatilla County project calls for resurfacing, and some minor earthwork and drainage on the Umatilla River-Union Pacific Railroad Crossing Section of the Lexington-Echo Highway in Echo. The project is 20 miles long and the paved width varies from 58 to 64 feet. Completion time is 90 calendar days.
