FIFTY YEARS AGO

B.F. Swaggart of Lexington writes "The farmers' best interest is to own mules instead of tractors" and he inserts the following offer: "The Eastern Oregon Stock Farm will furnish the farmers of Morrow County one fine jack free to serve himself and his neighbors; all the expense will be for the care and feeding of the animals. I have 12 jacks that can be used in 12 separate neighborhoods, and this will make a fair distribution over the county, so that every farmer can reach them. Come to my place and get a jack."

Woodrow Huston, youngest son of Mr. and Mrs. Guy Huston of Eight Mile, is a student of aeronautics in the mechanical division at the Tex Rankin School in Portland.

Farmers on lower Willow Creek, in cooperation with the Union Pacific railroad, have started a gopher poisoning campaign. The poisoning was made necessary to combat the pests this year because of a shortage of water to drown them out in the usual manner, reports C.W. Smith, county agent.

TWENTY-FIVE YEARS AGO

Three snowstorms during the past week added over three inches to Heppner's total snowfall for the winter, bringing the official measurement to 30 inches.

FIVE YEARS AGO

"There are approximately 322,000 acres in the Blue Mountain infested with mountain pine beetles" said Bill Carter of the supervisor's office of the United States Forestry Service at the Chamber of Commerce last Monday. He stated that the beetles will infest the larger trees around the edge of the stand and gradually work their way to the smaller trees. They seldom infest trees smaller than six inches in diameter as the bark on the smaller trees is too thin.
