Ken Nairns, Jr. manager and Tom Springer, T.V. technician, constructed the office counters and a desk.

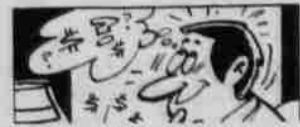
Ron Forrar has been contracted to make a sign which will hang over the sidewalk. Nairns expects the sign to be up by April 4.
