## Bookworms hear review of Auel's unusual novel

A Portland woman, Jean M. Auel, has begun writing what promises to be a most unusual series of historical novels titled "Earth's Children." The first book of her series "Clan of the Cave Bear" was published last year. Inez Erwin chose it for her review at the Bookworms' May 28 meeting in the home of Mrs. George Currin.

The story's setting is prehistoric Europe during the ice age over 35,000 years ago. It is a saga of a clan: how they lived; the animals they hunted; the great totems they revered. But mostly it is the story of Ayla, a girl they found and raised, who was not like them.

Ayla looked different, she laughed, she cried, she had the ability to speak. The conflict between the ancient clan and its traditions and this girl of a

newer breed, destined to alter life patterns, could not be resolved. The remarkable, intensely interesting epic, deals with a crucial time in evolution when two races are battling for existence.

The author feels that during this early period, as the ice age was beginning to end, that it is possible that Cro-Magnon and Neanderthal men lived in southeastern Europe at the same time. She carefully studied the ice age, constructed an ice cave and learned how living in it felt. She has presented an amazing story of the seasonal life of very primitive people. She gratefully acknowledges fine assistance from archaeologists, anthropologists and other specialists.

Readers of the first volume in the "Earth's Children" series will be eagerly anticipating more novels from Jean M. Auel.
