Lone boys first in Big Sky meet

On Saturday the Cardinal tracksters traveled to Condon for the Big Sky Track Meet. The lone boys came home with the first place trophy with 140 points. The girls placed fifth with 37 points.

Margaret Doherty placed second in the long jump with a jump of 14'7", second in the 100-meter dash with a time of 13.02, first in the 400 with a personal best of 61.9, and first in the 200 in a time of 26.63. Michelle LaRue placed sixth in the discus with a throw of 69'5".

Brad Schmidt placed third in the long jump with a jump of 18'7", fifth in the 1500 in a time of 5:24, and third in the 3000 with a time of 11:58.17. Denny Starr placed second in the discus with a throw of 105', fourth in the shot put with a toss of 35'8", second in the javelin with a throw of 140'4", and fourth in the 800 meter run in 2:33.4.

Gregg Rietmann placed second in the pole vault with a vault of 8'6", first in the 100 with a time of 11.28, and first in the 200-meter dash in 23.41. Shawn LaRue placed third in the 100 with a time of 13'9", first in the 110-meter hurdles with a time of 48.09, fifth in the high jump with a jump of 5'2", and second in the 300-meter hurdles in 44.3.

Jim McCabe placed fifth in the javelin with a throw of 116'1", first in the 400-meter dash with a time of 53.19, and fourth in the 300 hurdles in 48.0. Treve Peterson finished third in the 100 with a time of 11.91, third in the 400 with a time of 54.86, and second in the 200 in 24.15. Howard Leavitt finished fifth in the 100 meters with a time of 12.08.

The 400-meter relay team consisting of Leavitt, McCabe, Peterson and Rietmann finished first with a time of 46.5.

Team to host Jr. Olympics meet

The Heppner Junior High Track Team will be sponsoring an AAU Junior Olympics Track and Field Meet May 16, at the Heppner High School track.

Registration for all events will take place that morning from 10 a.m. to 11 a.m. Participants must register at that time. Late registration at the event will not be permitted.

The meet will begin at 11 a.m. with field events taking place first. Running events will follow.

The age divisions sanctioned for this meet are the following:

10 and under Age division (will be 10 or under during 81)

11-12 Age division (will be 11 or 12 during 1981)

13-14 Age division (will be 13 or 14 during 1981)

Any participant 12 and under may compete in 3 events, including relays. Thirteen- fourteen year-old age division participants may compete in 4 events, including relays.

"It is the purpose of this program to give every boy or girl who so desires, the opportunity to compete, regardless of ability," said a spokesperson.

This track meet may be used to qualify athletes for the state meet. The athlete must meet or better the qualifying standard to advance to the state meet.
