Notice is hereby given that on Monday, May 18, 1981, the Board of Equalization of the County of Morrow, Oregon, will meet at the County Courthouse in Heppner, Oregon, to publicly examine the assessment rolls for said County of Morrow, for the year 1981, and to correct all errors in valuation, description, or qualities of land, lots or other property assessed by the assessor.

The assessed valuation of homesteads assessed by the county assessor's office in Morrow County, as entered on the assessment roll for January 1, 1981, is 81.6 percent of the true cash (market) value of such property.

The assessed valuation of all other taxable property assessed by the county assessor's office in Morrow County, as entered on the assessment roll for January 1, 1981, is 84.4 percent of the true cash (market) value of such property.

Petitions for adjustment of assessments must be filed with the board not later than Monday, May 18, 1981, except when the filing of the petition at a different time is permitted under ORS 309.026 (for homestead property only), 309.035 or 309.103.
