

Three HHS tracksters to compete in state meet

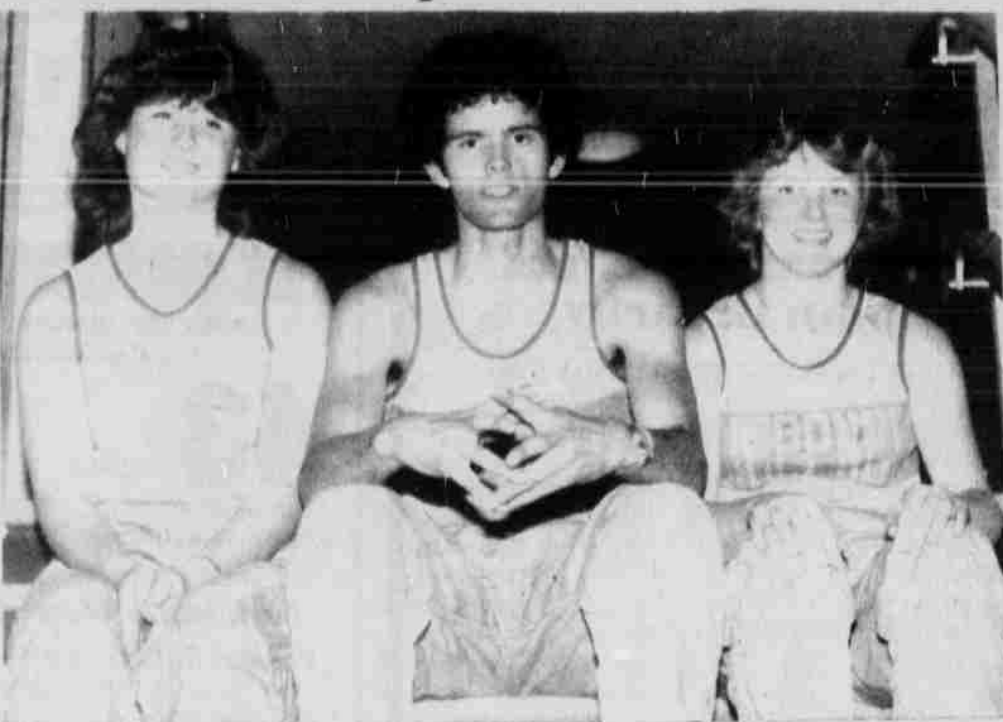
Mary Kincaid took first in the high jump, and Kellie Hammond took first in the javelin at district track meet Friday and Saturday in Umatilla.

The girls, along with Greg Sweeney who placed second in the 1500, will go on to the state championships this weekend at Lewis & Clark College in Portland.

"I thought our kids had some fantastic performances, everyone had terrific efforts," said head coach Dale Conklin of the teams appearance in the district meet.

To win first at district, Mary cleared 5-feet in the high jump her best jump this year. Kellie threw the javelin 108'8" to win first, and Greg ran the 1500 meters in 4:29.4 to place second. It was his best time ever.

Although her third place finish won't enable her to compete at state, Kellie also placed third at district in the discus throw. She tossed the disc 105'9" to break a school record. The old record was 99'.
