Irrigon postpones decision to hire officer

The community of Irrigon has been without police since last November and the minutes read at the city council meeting Tuesday revealed that the city has not made a decision on hiring a police-safety officer.

The committee stated that after advertising for a safety officer, there were only three applicants who had responded. The committee said the field of choice was not broad enough and should be advertised again. Action was taken to do so. Police coverage has been provided by the Sheriff's Dept. as deputies are available.

The city's future relation with the 911 emergency number was also discussed. Formation of a county-wide 911 service based in Heppner is under way but several changes would be necessary for the Irrigon community to participate. Since the area is presently included in Umatilla's prefix a different one would need to be assigned.

The emergency number has been in operation in the community for several years, based in Hermiston. It is presently operated through the Umatilla Police Dept. Recent correspondence from the city of Umatilla stated that they were not being adequately reimbursed for the 911 service. Umatilla indicated that cost to both would total \$1,000.

Mayor Don Eppenhach had met with Umatilla's mayor to discuss the matter.

Recorder Caryle Mayrand was instructed by the council to include the city's portion in the budget being prepared.

Mayor Eppenhach gave a report on the results of the trial heard recently in Circuit Court at Heppner involving the city. The case involved quieting title for abandoned railroad property that ran through the city, and which the railroad had deeded to the city of Irrigon.

A quit claim deed involving Pennock and Laverne Christiansen laid claim to portions of the property. The findings of the court disallowed these claims. Council action authorized acquiring title insurance for the property.
