

BMCC board renews 18 instructors' contracts

Eighteen of the nineteen Blue Mountain Community College instructors who had been without contracts for next year were rehired Wednesday, May 20, at the regular monthly meeting of the BMCC board of education.

The rehiring of the instructors came in the wake of successful passage of the BMCC budget levy by 6,344 votes to 4,333. Both Umatilla and Morrow county voters endorsed the BMCC budget. In Umatilla, the vote was 5,538 yes to 3,663 no. Morrow voters numbered 806 yes to 670 no. When the college has a better picture regarding state funding the college budget committee will meet to consider what changes are necessary.

The one instructor still without a contract is John Weddle, BMCC instrumental music instructor. A decision on that contract was postponed until the administration completes a review of staffing patterns for the music department.

In other business, the college board voted to approve a proposed construction and remodeling program as presented by Jim Lynch, architect. Total cost of the project is estimated to be \$545,600 which includes an addition to the north side of Morrow Hall and several remodeling projects.

The Morrow Hall addition will house college administrative functions including: Admissions Office, Business Office, evening division and instructional deans. The space vacated by these offices will provide additional room for the instructional programs.

Area students to get OSU degrees June 7

Oregon State University graduates on June 7 will come from every county and almost every city in the state, including many from Morrow County.

Those graduating from Morrow County include:

Boardman: Kevan R. Pratt, master of education.

Heppner: Mark P. Sargent, bachelor of science, science (with high scholarship); Allen M. McCabe, bachelor of science, liberal arts; Deborah K. Warren, bachelor of science, agriculture.

Ione: Joan M. Doherty, bachelor of science, liberal arts.

Irrigon: Steven P. Doherty, bachelor of science, science.

Lexington: Rebecca J. Lush, Bachelor of science, liberal arts (with high scholarship).

The 112th graduating class will be one of the largest in university history. About 3,451 degrees are expected to be awarded this year, approximately the same as a year ago. The 112 year total will go over the 96,000 mark, starting with a graduating class of three -two men and one woman-- in 1870.

The graduation program, set for 2 p.m. in Gill Coliseum on campus, will be telecast again this year by Oregon's public broadcasting network. The stations include KOAC-TV, Channel 7, Corvallis; KOAP-TV, Channel 10, Portland; and KTVR Channel 13, LaGrande.

In other business, the board:

- adopted the general fund budget and all self-sustaining funds for the 1981-82 fiscal

year totalling \$7,798,988. Resolutions were also adopted which levied the tax and made appropriations for the 1981-82 school year.

- endorsed a proposal to enact a four-day work week

for college employees during the summer months. The employees will still work 40 hours per week, but will not work on Fridays. The college realizes energy savings by not

having to air-condition buildings from Thursday evening until Monday morning.

- administered the oath of office to Jame Pratt, Hermis-

ton banker, who replaces Harmon Springer, Hermiston broadcaster, on the board.

- tabled a request from the city of Pendleton to grant an easement through the col-

lege's triangle piece of property at the foot of the college hill. The board decided to take action on the request when and if plans are made to build on the area.

- designated U.S. National Bank as the depository for college funds. The college funds are rotated yearly among banks in the two-county area.

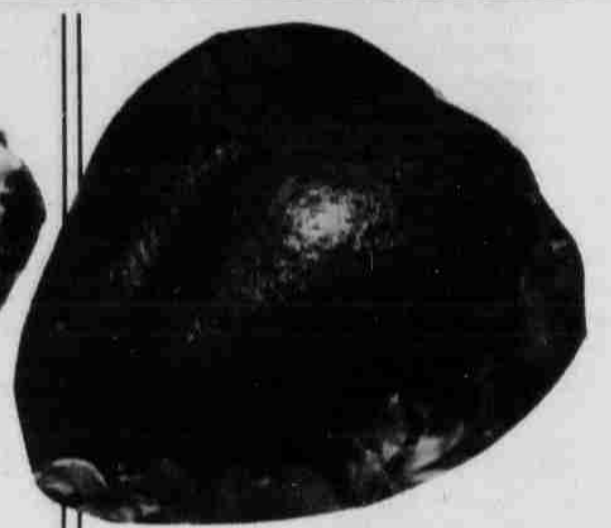
