

2. Three stems or three blooms on one stem of a variety constitutes an exhibit unless otherwise indicated.

3. Foliage of plant required on all specimens.
4. Professionals may enter for exhibit only.

**Some do's:**

1. Do check schedule before making entries.
2. Do choose most perfect specimens for each class.
3. Do have right number of blossoms or stems as indicated.
4. Do label with variety name.
5. Do groom flowers.
6. Do enter the right class and lot.
7. Do groom and water houseplants.

**Some Don'ts**

1. Do not attempt to arrange plants or flowers at the entry table.
2. Do not expect the superintendents to supply you with the name or class.
3. Do not enter a potted or hanging plant or flower that has not been in your possession less than ninety (90) days.

**Flower Hints**

1. Cut flowers in late afternoon of the day before they are exhibited, place immediately in deep luke warm water, free of drafts and in a dark place.
2. Select material in its prime and pest free.
3. Roses should have healthy stems, be shown with foliage, and blooms should be 1-3 to 1/2 open.
4. Gladioli should be 1-3 of flower fully opened, 1-3 of flower showing color and 1-3 of flower in tight buds.
5. Dahlias should have minimum of two leaves, no buds and the center should show.
6. When entering two or more blooms, each should be of the same size.

See daily schedule. There will be an opportunity for people to enter a contest of flower arranging. Bring your own tools, flowers and containers. Premiums same as exhibit entries.
